The AFC East Champion New England Patriots will aim to advance to the AFC Championship game when they clash with their divisional rivals, the New York Jets, in a Divisional Playoff Game this Sunday at Gillette Stadium. The Jets advanced to the second round of the playoffs with a 17-16 win last Saturday night against Indianapolis.

This week's game will be the third between the Patriots and Jets this season, with the teams splitting two regular-season contests. The Jets beat the Patriots, 28-14, at The New Meadowlands Stadium on Sept. 19, but New England evened the season series with a 45-3 win on Monday Night Football on Dec. 6.

New England and New York will meet in the playoffs for the third time. The Patriots won a first-round game 26-14 at Giants Stadium on Dec. 28, 1985 to begin their run to the 1985 AFC Championship. The Patriots 2006 team beat the Jets, 37-16, at Gillette Stadium in a first-round game on Jan. 7, 2007.

#### **SERIES HISTORY (51-51-1)**

The Patriots and Jets will meet for the 104th time, including two postseason games, since the series between the AFC East rivals began in 1960. The Jets took the lead in the series 51-50-1 following a 28-14 win in Week 2 on Sept. 19 of the 2010 season at the New Meadowlands Stadium. The Patriots evened the





series with a 45-3 victory in the rematch in Week 13 on Dec. 6 in a Monday Night Football game at Gillette Stadium.

The teams split the season series in each of the last three seasons.

The Patriots are 7-3 against the Jets all-time at Gillette Stadium.

The teams have played in the postseason two times, a 1985 Wild

Card game and a 2006 Wild Card game. New England beat the Jets, 26-14 in 1985 at Giants Stadium on their way to Super Bowl XX. In 2006, the Patriots defeated the Jets, 37-16, at Gillette Stadium.

The New England Patriots moved into sole possession of first place in the AFC East with a 45-3 romp over the New York Jets at Gillette stadium on Monday Night Football. QB Tom Brady threw four touchdown passes and 326 yards in his NFL-record 26<sup>th</sup> straight regular-season home victory.



### PATRIOTS SET TEAM RECORD WITH TURNOVER DIFFERENTIAL OF +28

The Patriots set a franchise record by finishing the 2010 season with a turnover differential of +28, forcing 38 turnovers while allowing just 10 turnovers. The previous Patriots' team record for best turnover differential in a season was +17, a record which was set in 2003. The Patriots finished 13-0 in 2010 when recording a positive turnover differential. ### PATRIOTS DEFENSE PRODUCES FIFTH TOUCHDOWN OF THE SEASON

Kyle Arrington's interception return against Green Bay (12/19) was the Patriots' fifth defensive touchdown of the season (4 interception returns and 1 fumble return). The team record for most defensive touchdowns is six by the 2007 team (3 interception returns and 3 fumble returns). The Patriots also had five defensive touchdowns in 2003 (5 interception returns), 2001 (5 interception returns), 1992 (3 interception returns and 3 fumble returns) and 1961 (2 interception returns and 3 fumble returns).

### PATRIOTS HAVE FOUR INTERCEPTIONS RETURNED FOR A SCORE IN 2010

Arrington's 36-yard interception return is the Patriots fourth interception returned for a touchdown in 2010. The four interceptions returned for a touchdown in 2010 is tied for third in team history, trailing the five the team had in 2003 and 2001. The Patriots also returned four interceptions for touchdowns in 1997.

### PATRIOTS FINISH 2010 WITH NFL-LEADING 25 INTERCEPTIONS

The Patriots led the NFL with 25 interceptions in 2010. The 25 interceptions in 2010 by the Patriots is tied for the fourth-highest single-season total in team history. The only times the Patriots have had more interceptions in a season were in 1964 (31 interceptions), 1963 (29 interceptions) and 2003 (29 interceptions).

#### PATRIOTS BECOME FIRST TEAM IN NFL HISTORY TO SCORE A TD FIVE DIFFERENT WAYS IN THE SAME GAME

The Patriots became the first team in NFL history to score a touchdown five different ways in the same game at Miami (10/04). The Patriots scored a rushing touchdown, a receiving touchdown, had a kickoff returned for a touchdown, blocked a field goal that was returned for a touchdown and returned an interception for a touchdown.

### THREE WITH TWO TDS, QB WITH 4 TDS AND A PERFECT RATING

For the second time in team history the Patriots had three players finish with two touchdowns and a four-touchdown effort by the quarterback with a perfect rating. Wes Welker, Deion Branch and BenJarvus Green-Ellis each had two touchdowns and Tom Brady had four touchdowns with a perfect rating at Detroit (11/25). On Oct. 29, 1978 the Patriots defeated the Jets 55-21. Harold Jackson, Horace Ivory and James McAlister each had two touchdowns in the win. Steve Grogan threw four touchdowns in the game and finished with a perfect rating.

### PATRIOTS RUSH FOR 200 YARDS IN BOTH GAMES AGAINST BUFFALO

The Patriots rushed for over 200 yards in both games against AFC East rival Buffalo. In the first meeting on Sept. 26, the Patriots gained exactly 200 yards rushing, and then in the rematch at Buffalo (12/26), the Patriots rushed for a season-high 217 yards. In 2008, the Patriots had two games with 200 or more rushing yards with 257 vs. Denver (10/20/08) and 277 at Oakland (12/14/08). New England has rushed for 200 or more yards in a game twice or more in a single season 14 times in team history.

#### THE PATRIOTS FORCE SEVEN TURNOVERS

The Patriots forced seven turnovers in the win at Buffalo (12/26). The seven takeaways are tied for the third most in a game by the Patriots. The Patriots record for most takeaways in a game is 10 at the New York Jets (11/21/76). The Patriots had eight forced turnovers vs. Houston (11/1/63) and vs. Buffalo (11/7/76) and also had seven vs. NY Jets (9/27/64), vs. Denver (11/6/66) and at LA Rams (12/11/83).

### PATRIOTS RECOVER FOUR FUMBLES FOR THE THE SECOND TIME SINCE 2001

The Patriots recovered four fumbles in the win at Buffalo (12/26) the second time since 2001. The last time the Patriots recovered four fumbles was on Sept. 14, 2003 against Philadelphia.

#### PATRIOTS ROOKIES PRODUCE 9 INTERCEPTIONS

The Patriots 2010 rookie produced 9 interceptions in 2010, the most of any team's rookie class. CB Devin McCourty recorded 7, LB Brandon Spikes 1 and LB Dane Fletcher 1.

#### PATRIOTS ROOKIES RECORD 7 SACKS

The Patriots 2010 rookie class produced 7 sacks in 2010, third in the NFL to Cincinnati (12.5) and Detroit with 10.

#### PATRIOTS ENTER POSTSEASON ON A ROLL

The Patriots finished the 2010 season with an average 21.8 average margin of victory, the best ever compared to the four previous Patriots' teams that reached the Super Bowl.

QB Tom Brady, T Matt Light, G Logan Mankins, LB Jerod Mayo, CB Devin McCourty, S Brandon Meriweather, WR Wes Welker and NT Vince Wilfork have been selected to represent the New England Patriots and the AFC in the



2011 Pro Bowl on Jan. 30 at Aloha Stadium in Hawaii. Brady, Mankins and Wilfork were selected as starters, while Light, Mayo, McCourty, Meriweather and Welker were selected as reserves.

It is the sixth Pro Bowl selection for Brady (2001, 2004, 2005, 2007, 2009 and 2010), the third for Light (2006, 2007 and 2010) Mankins (2007, 2009 and 2010), Welker (2008, 2009 and 2010) and Wilfork (2007, 2009 and 2010) and second for Meriweather (2009 and 2010).

McCourty is the fourth Patriots player to be selected to the Pro Bowl as a rookie, joining Mike Haynes (1976), John Stephens (1988) and Curtis Martin (1995).

Bill Belichick is the only head coach in NFL history to win three Super Bowl titles in a four-year span. He spent 20 years as an assistant coach in the NFL and this is his 16th season as a head coach. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the only man in NFL history to serve 20 or more seasons as an assistant coach and at least 15 seasons as a head coach. In the 2007 season, Belichick led the Patriots to the fourth undefeated and untied regular season in the NFL's 90-year history and the first since the NFL established a 16-game schedule in 1978.

#### BELICHICK LEADS TEAM TO 10<sup>TH</sup> STRAIGHT WINNING RECORD

Bill Belichick has led the Patriots to a winning record for 10 consecutive seasons (2001-2010). The only other NFL coach to have at least 10 consecutive winning seasons with one team since the 1970 merger was Tom Landry, who led the Dallas Cowboys to 16 consecutive winning seasons (1970-1985).

#### BELICHICK LEADS TEAM NFL-BEST 14-2 RECORD

Bill Belichick has guided the Patriots to an NFL-best 14-2 record in 2010. Belichick is the first head coach ever to win at least 14 regular-season games in four separate seasons. Only four other coaches — San Francisco's George Seifert (3), Washington's Joe Gibbs (2), Chicago's Mike Ditka (2) and Miami's Don Shula (2) — have more than one 14-win season.

### BRADY GOES 11 STRAIGHT STARTS WITHOUT AN INTERCEPTION

Brady finished the season with 11 straight starts without an interception. That is the most consecutive starts without an interception in the NFL since the 1970 merger. The previous best was nine straight starts by Jason Campbell (2007-08) and Bernie Kosar (1991).

#### BRADY IS PATRIOTS ALL-TIME LEADING PASSER

Tom Brady passed Drew Bledsoe in 2009 to become the Patriots all-time passing yardage leader and currently has 34,744 career passing yards.

### PATRIOTS OFFENSIVE NOTES

#### **DEION BRANCH RETURNS TO THE PATRIOTS**

Deion Branch was acquired by the Patriots in a trade with Seattle on Oct. 12, 2010. Originally a second-round pick of the Patriots in 2002, Branch was traded to Seattle in 2006 for a first round pick (Brandon Meriweather). Branch returns to a team that he helped win two Super Bowls. Branch was awarded the Pete Rozelle Trophy as the Most Valuable Player of Super Bowl XXXIX. His 11 receptions in the game tied the Super Bowl record, also achieved by Jerry Rice, Dan Ross and Wes Welker. On the day of Super Bowl XXXIX, Deion called a dozen of his former football coaches to thank them for the support that they gave him throughout his high school, junior college and college careers. Hours after talking to his coaches, he tied the Super Bowl record with 11 receptions and was named MVP of the game. Branch has turned in his biggest performances on the greatest stage in sports, leading all receivers in Super Bowls XXXVIII and XXXIX. He recorded a combined 21 receptions in the two games and owns two of the top seven receiving performances in Super Bowl history. His career reception total in the Super Bowl ranks third all-time, trailing only Jerry Rice (33) and Andre Reed (27)

#### **DEION BRANCH HAS CAREER LONG**

The 79-yard touchdown pass from Tom Brady to Deion Branch at Detroit (11/25) is the longest reception of Branch's career. His previous best was a 66-yard touchdown pass from Brady at Denver on Nov. 3, 2003.

#### **ADDITIONAL BRANCH NOTES**

- Finished the season with a career-high six touchdowns (five with New England, one with Seattle).
- Finished with 61 receptions for 818 yards (13.4 average).

### DAN CONNOLLY HAS THE LONGEST KICKOFF RETURN EVER BY AN OFFENSIVE LINEMAN

Dan Connolly was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Week after he returned a kickoff 71 yards to the 4-yard line in the second quarter of the Patriots win vs. Green Bay on Dec. 19. According to Elias Sports Bureau, it is the longest kickoff return by an offensive lineman in NFL history. The run by Connolly topped the 48-yard touchdown return by Atlanta's Mal Snider in 1969. The previous longest kickoff return for a Patriots offensive lineman was a 27-yard return by G Stephen Neal on Nov. 30, 2008 vs. Pittsburgh. Connolly's previous best was a 16-yard return vs. Miami on Nov. 8, 2009. Connolly's return set up a 2yard touchdown pass from Tom Brady to Aaron Hernandez that cut the Packers' lead to 17-14. Joked T Matt Light, "Dan Connolly has the best average for a kickoff returned in the NFL. I couldn't believe it when I was watching it. But you put the ball in the hands of an offensive lineman, and, well, naturally [what Connolly did] is not a real shocker."

#### **CRUMPLER: PATRIOTS CAPTAINS**

During the Bye Week, veteran TE Alge Crumpler was added as a team captain. Said Crumpler on joining the list, "It was an honor. Coach announced it to the team on Wednesday. I just need to continue to do the things that I've set forth from the first day I stepped into this organization, that's help this team win. I've been through a lot of situations; I've been a captain before. I didn't expect this, but I embrace the opportunity to keep leading and keep helping this ball club win games."

#### JULIAN EDELMAN SETS FRANCHISE RECORD WITH A 94-YARD PUNT RETURN FOR A TOUCHDOWN

WR Julian Edelman set a franchise record with a 94-yard punt return for a touchdown in the second quarter vs. Miami (01/02). The Patriots' previous longest punt return was an 89-yard touchdown return by Mike Haynes vs. Buffalo on Nov. 7, 1976. It is the first punt return for a touchdown by the Patriots since Troy Brown had a 68-yard return at Carolina on Jan. 6, 2002.

### EDELMAN SETS PATRIOTS RECORD FOR BEST PUNT RETURN AVERAGE IN A SEASON

Edelman set a franchise record for the best punt return average in a single season with a 15.3-yard punt return average in 2010. The previous best was a 14.8 punt return average by Mack Herron in 1974. Edelman led the AFC and finished second in the NFL with a 15.3 punt return average. Chicago's Devin Hester set led the NFL with a 17.1-yard average.

#### EDELMAN GOES FROM STANDOUT QB TO WR

Julian Edelman began his college football career with a year at the College of San Mateo (Calif.) before transferring to Kent State where as a senior he completed 56% of his passes (153 of 275 passes for 1,820 yards) with 13 touchdowns. He was also the leading rusher, gaining 1,551 yards on 215 attempts (an average of 7.5 yards per carry) and scoring 13 touchdowns. His offensive numbers broke Kent State's single-season record for total offense set by Joshua Cribbs in 2003.

#### **GREEN-ELLIS GOES OVER 1,000 YARDS**

RB BenJarvus Green-Ellis finished the 2010 season with 1,008 rushing yards, becoming the first Patriots player to top the 1,000-yard rushing mark since Corey Dillon had a team-record 1,635 rushing yards in 2004. Green-Ellis is the 11th New England player to record a 1,000-yard rushing season. Green-Ellis recorded his 1,000-yard season without fumbling the ball all year, joining Baltimore's Ray Rice as the only NFL backs with at least 175 rushing attempts and no fumbles this season. Green-Ellis and Rice are the first running backs to have a 1,000-yard season without a fumble since DeAngelo Williams had a 1,000-yard season without a fumble in 2008.

RB BenJarvus Green-Ellis rushed for 13 touchdowns, while TE Rob Gronkowski had 10 receiving touchdowns. It is the third time in team history that the Patriots had two players finish with 10 or more touchdowns in a season. In 1974, Mack Herron had 12 touchdowns (7 rushing, 5 receiving) and Sam Cunningham had 11 (9 rushing, 2 receiving). In 1976, Steve Grogan had 12 touchdowns (12 rushing) and Andy Johnson had 10 touchdowns (6 rushing, 4 receiving). #### **BENJARVUS GREEN-ELLIS – THE LAW FIRM**

BenJarvus Green-Ellis earned the nickname the Law Firm from his Patriots teammates because of his multi-part name. He was signed by the Patriots as an undrafted free agent in 2008 out of the University of Mississippi. As a rookie, he recorded touchdowns in four straight games after being called up from the practice squad in October. His knack for finding the end zone has continued this season as he has reached the end zone a career-high 12 times, including his first 2-touchdown performance vs. Minnesota (10/31). Green-Ellis also had a 112-yard rushing performance against the Vikings with 62 yards on the Patriots' final fourth quarter touchdown drive that extended a 3-point lead to a 10-point cushion in a 28-18 victory

#### **ROOKIE TIGHT ENDS ARE MAKING AN IMPACT**

Rob Gronkowski finished first among all rookie tight ends with 10 touchdown catches, while Aaron Hernandez ranked second with six. Gronkowski and Hernandez are the first pair of rookie tight end teammates with at least five TD receptions in the same season in NFL history.

#### **GRONKOWSKI SCORES ON HIS FIRST CATCH**

Rookie TE Rob Gronkowski scored on a 1-yard touchdown pass from Tom Brady in the fourth quarter vs. Cincinnati (9/16). It was his first NFL reception. Gronkowski is the first Patriots rookie to score a touchdown on opening day since WR Deion Branch in 2002.

#### GRONKOWSKI SETS PATS ROOKIE TE MARK

Gronkowski finished 2010 with 10 touchdowns to establish a record for most touchdown catches by a rookie tight end in Patriots history, besting Russ Francis (4 in 1975) and Don Hasselbeck (4 in 1977). Gronkowski became the first Patriots rookie to ever record three touchdowns in a game with a three-TD game at Pittsburgh (11/14).



Gronkowski set a Patriots rookie record for receiving touchdowns in a season, moving past WR Jim Colclough and WR Randy Vataha, who each had nine. Gronkowski ranks second in NFL history for touchdowns by a rookie tight end overall. Only Mike Ditka (12) had more touchdowns as a rookie tight end. Gronkowski's 10 touchdowns are the highest single-season total by a Patriots tight end in franchise history. Gronkowski is only the fourth Patriots player to record 10 or more touchdown receptions in a season, joining Randy Moss (3 times), Stanley Morgan (2) and Jim Colclough (1).

- Recorded his first 100-yard game with a career-high 101 receiving yards on six receptions at the NY Jets (9/19), including a career-long 46-yard catch.
- Set the record for the longest run by a tight end in Patriots history with a 13-yard run vs. Buffalo (9/26) and then broke his own record with an 18-yard rush vs. Baltimore (10/14).
- Registered his first two NFL touchdowns at Cleveland (11/7). He scored his first NFL touchdown on a 2-yard reception in the second quarter and then had a 1-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter.
- Posted the second two-touchdown game of his career vs. Green Bay (12/19).

#### BRIAN HOYER THROWS FIRST NFL TOUCHDOWN

Backup QB Brian Hoyer recorded his first career touchdown pass on a 44-yard pass to Brandon Tate vs. Miami (1/2). It was his second NFL touchdown. He had his first NFL touchdown on a 1-yard rush vs. Tennessee (10/18/09).

#### MATTHEW SLATER: LIKE FATHER LIKE SON

WR Matthew Slater spent his college days at UCLA. Matthew's father, Jackie Slater, a Hall of Fame offensive tackle, spent his entire career with the Rams organization in LA. Matthew Slater, drafted in 2008, is one of six sons of Hall of Fame members to be drafted in NFL history.

#### **BRANDON TATE RETURNS TWO IN 2010**

Brandon Tate has blossomed into a dual threat in both the return game and the receiving game. He has returned two kickoffs for touchdowns to provide the Patriots a spark on special teams, after returning the second half kickoff vs. Cincinnati 97 yards for a touchdown and



the second half kickoff at Miami 103 yards for a touchdown. He is the first Patriots player to return two kicks for touchdowns in a season since Kevin Faulk returned two for a touchdown in 2002. The Patriots record for most kickoff returns for a touchdown in a season is three by Raymond Clayborn in 1977. His prowess for returns carries over from his collegiate days where he holds numerous NCAA and ACC career records including the NCAA career record for combined kick and punt return yards with 3,523. A native of North Carolina, Tate was a four-year return man for the Tar Heels. Tate suffered a knee injury against Notre Dame as a senior and missed the final seven games of the season. Tate joined the Patriots in the third round of the 2009 draft, but his rookie year was derailed by injury as he was placed on injured reserve on Nov. 14 after seeing action in only two games.

#### **ADDITIONAL TATE NOTES**

- Finished the season with five touchdowns (three receiving, two kickoff returns) and 432 receiving yards on 24 catches.
- Ranked third in the AFC and sixth in the NFL with a 25.8 kickoff return average, having returned 41 kickoffs for 1057 yards.

- Led the team with four receptions of more than 40 yards (65-yard touchdown catch vs. Minnesota on Oct. 31; 45-yarder at Pittsburgh on Nov. 14 and a 42-yard touchdown catch and 40-yarder vs. Miami on Jan. 2).

#### FRED TAYLOR AMONG NFL'S BEST

Fred Taylor ranks 15th in NFL history for most rushing yards with career totals of 2,534 carries for 11,695 yards and 66 rushing touchdowns in 153 games. He trails only New York's LaDainian Tomlinson (13,404) among active running backs in rushing yards. Taylor ranks among the NFL's all-time best in several categories.

### GREETINGS FROM KAARST, GERMANY: SEBASTIAN VOLLMER MAKES HIS MARK

A native of Kaarst, Germany, Vollmer did not begin playing football until the age of 14 when he started playing for the Dusseldorf club team. Vollmer helped lead his German prep school team to two national football championships. His early football success landed him an appearance in the 2004 Global Junior Championships in San Diego, which led him to a scholarship at Houston. He spoke almost no English when he signed with Houston, but he became fluent in the language as he developed from a 250-pound tight end into a 315-pound lineman who started his final 25 games at tackle for the Cougars. Vollmer's collegiate career created interest from the NFL where the Patriots drafted him in the second round of the 2009 draft. Nicknamed Seabass, during his playing days at Houston. The nickname has carried over to the NFL.

### DANNY WOODHEAD SET TEAM MARK FOR RUSHING AVERAGE

Danny Woodhead finished the season with 97 rushes for 551 yards, with his average of 5.68 yards per carry setting a new team record (minimum 90 rushing attempts). Woodhead topped Don Calhoun's previous team mark of 5.59 yards per carry in 1976 (129 attempts for 721 yards).

#### WOODHEAD GOES FROM DIVISION II TO THE NFL

Danny Woodhead was a standout at Division II Chadron State in Nebraska. He averaged 178.9 yards per game and totaled 101 rushing touchdowns during his collegiate career. Woodhead's outstanding junior and senior seasons earned him two Harlon Hill Trophies, the Division II equivalent to the Heisman Trophy. He is one of just three players to ever win two or more Harlon Hill Trophies, joining Texas A&M University-Kingsville running back Johnny Bailey, who won it three times (1987-89) before playing six seasons in the NFL for the Bears, Cardinals, and Rams. Valdosta State University's Dusty Bonner was the only other player to win the Harlon Hill Trophy multiple times (2000 and 2001). Cincinnati Bengals running back Bernard Scott (2008—Abilene Christian) joins Woodhead as active NFL running backs who have won the award.

#### PATRIOTS CALL ON VETERAN K SHAYNE GRAHAM

Many kickers have quite a journey before landing a roster position on an NFL team. Such has been the case during kicker Shayne Graham's road to a 10-year NFL career. He originally signed with New Orleans as a rookie free agent in 2000 and went to camp with Seattle in 2001 before finally securing a roster spot with Buffalo later that season. He then spent time with Carolina before a seven-year stint with Cincinnati. Graham went to camp with Baltimore in 2010 and had a week stint on the Giants roster. He spent time in between jobs practicing at the Virginia Tech campus with two pieces of packed luggage in his car at all times as he waited for a call for a team in need.

### ZOLTAN MESKO SET AN NFL ROOKIE RECORD FOR NET PUNTING AVERAGE

Zoltan Mesko finished with a 38.4 net average to set an NFL rookie record for net punting average. His 38.4 net average is the highest of any rookie punter since the net punting average was first tracked in 1976, surpassing the 38.0 net average that Los Angeles Rams' Dale Hatcher set in 1985.

### MESKO CHANGES FIELD POSITION TO HELP PATRIOTS BEAT BALTIMORE

Mesko notched a career-long 65-yard punt in overtime S. Baltimore (10/17), marking the longest overtime punt in Patriots history: With the Patriots facing a fourth-and-6 from their own 16-yard line in overtime, Mesko's 65-yard punt significantly changed field position, giving the Ravens possession at their own 19-yard line and keeping the Patriots alive to win, 23-20.



#### **ZOLTAN MESKO: COMING TO AMERICA**

Rookie P Zoltan Mesko was born in Timosoara, Romania on the Romania-Hungary border. On Many occasions in 1989, during the communist revolutions, his family was forced to take cover to avoid gun shots from the armies. Even after the fall of the Berlin Wall, his family lived in poverty. His family left Romania when his father won a United States Permanent Resident Card (green card) in the Diversity Immigrant Visa Lottery in 1997 when Mesko was 11.

#### MESKO DISCOVERS FOOTBALL

An avid soccer player from his days in Romania, Mesko had a strong leg. It was only when he came to America that he discovered his leg could take him places. In eighth grade, Mesko was playing kickball in the gym when he kicked the ball so high that he broke a light fixture. He was given a choice: pay for the light fixture or play football. With his family still struggling with money and football being a more popular sport than soccer at his school, the choice was an obvious one—Mesko decided to play football. His leg would land him numerous Division I scholarships and admission offers from Ivy League schools. From these, Mesko chose to play football at Michigan.

### WELKER LEADS TEAM IN RECEPTIONS FOR RECORD FOURTH STRAIGHT YEAR IN 2010

Wes Welker became the first Patriots player to lead the team in receiving in four straight years after finishing 2010 with 86 receptions. The 86 receptions tied for sixth best in the NFL. He also led the team in receiving yards (848) for the third straight year. Welker suffered a knee injury in the 2009 regular-season finale at Houston and missed New England's postseason game vs. Baltimore. Welker returned from his injury well ahead of expectations and was back in the starting lineup for the season-opener in 2010.

### WELKER HAD THREE STRAIGHT 100 CATCH AND 1,000 YARD SEASONS

Welker registered his third straight season with at least 100 receptions (123) and 1,000 receiving yards (1,348) in 2009. Only four other NFL players have had three consecutive seasons of at least 100 receptions and 1,000 yards receiving: Marvin Harrison (4, 1999-02), Brandon Marshall (3, 2007-09), Herman Moore (3, 1995-97) and Jerry Rice (3, 1994-96).

Welker led the NFL with 123 receptions in 2009, despite missing two games and most of the season-finale due to an injury. He averaged 8.8 receptions in the 14 games he played. #### WELKER'S ROUTE TO THE NFL

Despite being named the Oklahoma football player of the year by both USA Today and the Daily Oklahoman, Wes Welker's only scholarship offer came from Texas Tech, and only after a player that committed to Texas Tech backed out. "I was thinking I'd get a scholarship somewhere," Welker said. "When it didn't happen, when it was supposed, to I was pretty hurt by it." Welker had an impressive collegiate career, accumulating 259 receptions and eight punts returned for touchdowns. He even won a national award as the best special teams player in the country. Despite those accolades, he was passed over in the 2004 NFL draft and signed with San Diego as a free agent. He made the team, then was cut after the first game. He signed with Miami soon after and was used just on special teams. He caught New England's eye with a 71-yard punt return on Monday Night Football in a game against the Patriots. He was acquired by the Patriots in a trade with Miami in 2007

#### WELKER PRESSED INTO SERVICE AS A KICKER

Welker was pressed into service as a kicker for the second time in his career at Cleveland (11/7/10) and was successful on an extra point attempt and handled a kickoff both in the fourth quarter. Welker was filling in for the injured Stephen Gostkowski (thigh). While with Miami in 2004, he was pressed into action in a game at New England (10/10/04) and converted one extra point, a 29-yard field goal and also handled kickoff duties.

### KYLE ARRINGTON SCORES ON A 36-YARD INTERCEPTION RETURN

Kyle Arrington registered his first NFL interception and returned it 36 yards for a touchdown in the third quarter vs. GB (12/19). Arrington's interception return was his second touchdown of 2010. He scored when he returned a blocked field goal 35 yards for a touchdown at Miami on Oct. 4.

### PATRICK CHUNG RECORDS HIS FIRST NFL BLOCKED PUNT AND BLOCKED FIELD GOAL

S Patrick Chung blocked a second half punt and field goal at Miami (10/04) to become the first NFL player to do both in a single game since Houston CB Ramon Walker had a blocked field goal and punt vs. New England on Nov. 23, 2003. Chung blocked a second half punt to give the Patriots a first down at the



Miami 15-yard line and set up a 12-yard touchdown run by RB BenJarvus Green-Ellis. Chung then blocked a 53-yard field goal attempt in the fourth quarter that was recovered by CB Kyle Arrington and returned for a touchdown. Chung was a two-time special teams player of the year during his college career at Oregon.

#### PATRICK CHUNG'S JOURNEY TO THE NFL

Long before S Patrick Chung picked up flag football as a teen, his mother, Jamaican recording artist Sophia George, had preached about being a tough man in a song. Her hit single, "Girlie Girlie" - a traditional reggae song about poking fun at a boy who was not man enough - topped the charts in 1985. Chung is aware that among his talents he was born with speed and agility - singing is not one of them. Chung, who possesses a great sense of pride in his unique heritage - his mother is Jamaican and his father is half Jamaican and half Chinese, was born in Jamaica and moved to California at age 12 where he started to play football as a freshman in high school. Chung went on to star at Oregon, where he holds the distinction of starting more games than any other defensive player in school history with 51 starts. He originally entered the draft as junior, but ultimately decided to return for his senior season. Pinned to the back of his locker is a reminder of the support he has gotten a Jamaican flag that indicates his family's importance to him.

LB Gary Guyton returned a fumble 35 yards for a touchdown at Chicago (12/12) and returned an interception 59 yards for a touchdown in the season-opener vs. Cincinnati (9/12). Guyton is the first Patriots player to score two defensive touchdowns in a season since LB Tedy Bruschi returned two interceptions for touchdowns in 2003.

### GUYTON AND ARRINGTON RETURN FIRST CAREER INTERCEPTIONS FOR SCORES

LB Gary Guyton intercepted his first pass vs. Cincinnati (9/12) and returned it 59 yards for a touchdown, and CB Kyle Arrington returned his first career interception vs. Green Bay (12/19) 36 yards for a touchdown. The Patriots now have three players on the roster who have returned an interception for a score on their first career pick. James Sanders returned his first pick 39 yards for a touchdown at Buffalo on Dec. 11, 2005.

#### **GUYTON HAS THE WORK ETHIC**

Gary Guyton was not drafted into the NFL, but through a solid work ethic was able to make the 53-man roster and has been a solid player over the last three seasons for the Patriots. Taking a peak into his work history shows his work ethic goes beyond the football field. At the end of his rookie season, Guyton went back to Georgia Tech and worked as an office assistant at the school's research institute.

"I was an office assistant, right there at the desk," said Guyton, who worked for a small wage at Georgia Tech Research Institute. "Just a regular office assistant. Tech is my school and I enjoyed it."

"He's smart, well prepared," Bill Belichick said. "He understands. He's got a real good understanding of football. Not just his role, but where other people have to be. That's what you really want in a defensive signal-caller, someone that understands how it all works."

It's been a long road," Guyton said. "I have come far. I've achieved some things. But I don't look back, just forward."

#### **MAYO LED NFL WITH 193 TOTAL TACKLES**

LB Jerod Mayo finished first in the NFL with a career-high 193 total tackles in 2010 with two 19-tackle games: vs. BLT (10/17) and vs. GB (12/19). He had 139 tackles as a rookie in 2008 and 114 in 2009 and with his 193 tackles in 2010 he is the first Patriots player to have three consecutive 100-tackle seasons since



Lawyer Milloy registered five straight 100-tackle seasons from 1997 through 2001. His 193 tackle are the highest since LB Steve Nelson had 207 tackles in 1984 and are the third highest in team history. Mayo had ten games in 2010 with 10-plus tackles.

#### DOUBLE TROUBLE: CB DEVIN MCCOURTY

After being selected by the Patriots in the first round of the 2010 NFL Draft, CB Devin McCourty became part of a select group in league history. McCourty's identical twin brother, Jason, is a cornerback with Tennessee, selected in the sixth round of the 2009 NFL Draft. The two are the 11<sup>th</sup> set of twins to play in the NFL. Devin and Jason were cornerbacks in the Rutgers secondary from 2005-08. Devin redshirted for the 2005 season and therefore was a year behind his brother in eligibility. McCourty is the second twin to suit up for the Patriots, after CB Kato Serwanga was a member of the team from 1998-2000. His twin brother Wasswa played for San Francisco and Minnesota from 1999-2001. According to McCourty's mother, the two can only be told apart by tiny scars on their faces left by chickenpox.

#### ADDITIONAL MCCOURTY NOTES

- His 17 passes defended tied for seventh in the league.
- Selected to his first Pro Bowl, becoming the fourth Patriots player to be selected as a rookie (Mike Haynes, 1976; John Stephens, 1988; Curtis Martin, 1995).
- Recorded his first career interception at San Diego (10/24).
- Recorded an interception for the third straight game, and his fourth in a three-game span, with an interception vs. the NY Jets (12/6), making him the first Patriots player to intercept a pass in three consecutive games since Asante Samuel did it in 2007.
- Recorded his first career two-interception game at Detroit on Thanksgiving Day (11/25). McCourty is the first Patriots rookie to have a two-interception game since Mike Haynes had three in a game on Nov. 21, 1976 at the Jets.
- Recorded his first career sack, bringing down Matt Flynn for a 4-yard loss on first down in the fourth quarter vs.
   Green Bay (12/19), starting off a defensive series in which the Patriots forced a key three-and-out while trailing 27-24 in a 31-27 win.

#### BRANDON MERIWEATHER HAS SECOND PRO BOWL SEASON IN 2010

- Finished the season with three interceptions, 66 total tackles and one fumble recovery.
- Selected as a member of the AFC Pro Bowl squad, marking his second consecutive selection.
- Intercepted a Ryan Fitzpatrick pass with 2:58 left in a 38-30 win vs. Buffalo (12/26) to seal the victory.

### ROB NINKOVICH'S 63-YARD FUMBLE RETURN IS SECOND LONGEST IN TEAM HISTORY

LB Rob Ninkovich returned a second quarter fumble 63 yards at San Diego (10/24). It is the second longest fumble return in team history to the 68-yard touchdown return by Richard Seymour at Buffalo on Oct. 3, 2004.

#### ADDITIONAL NINKOVICH NOTES

- Finished the season with career-bests of 58 total tackles on defense, 4.0 sacks, two interceptions, three passes defended, three fumble recoveries and 11 special team tackles.
- His three fumble recoveries tied for first in the AFC and third in the NFL.
- Recorded his first two NFL interceptions and added a sack at Miami (10/4).
- Registered his first career two-sack game vs. Miami (1/2), taking down Tyler Thigpen for a 3-yard loss in the second quarter and an 8-yard loss in the fourth quarter.

#### WILFORK HAS SECOND STRAIGHT PRO BOWL SEASON IN 2010

- Finished the season with 87 total tackles, second in his career to his 91 tackles in 2005.
- Named as a co-captain for the third-straight season.
- Selected as a starter for the Pro Bowl for the third time in his career (2007, 2009 and 2010).
- Credited with his first career two-sack game, vs. Miami (1/2), sacking Chad Henne for losses of nine yards and six yards on the same third-quarter possession.

#### WILFORK WEARS HIS HEART ON HIS NECK

Vince Wilfork wears No. 75 over his shoulder pads. Underneath hangs a gold chain locket for those who were number one in his heart: his parents. In 2002, parents David and Barbara Wilfork both passed away within five months of each other, leaving the then University of Miami star without his greatest support system. Wilfork, who lost his father to diabetes, has raised hundreds of thousands of dollars for diabetes-related causes. His annual draft day fundraiser, a bowling event he has held for seven years, is one of the signature fundraising events held by a pro athlete in New England. For his charity work, Wilfork was awarded the 2010 New England Patriots Ron Burton Community Service Award. While he will always cherish his National Championship and Super Bowl rings, his constant reminder lies closest to his heart, a picture of his late parents at their high school prom. "I carry them with me wherever I go," Wilfork said of his parents' keepsake. "My parents pushed me to be the best I could be. The things I do and my wife does, we do out of the kindness of our heart, and we do it for the community. I never look for anything in return. My teammates are my second family. My kids, my wife, the New England Patriots - that's all I

- Finished the season with 63 total tackles, one forced fumble, one fumble recovery, six passes defended and career-high three interceptions.



FOXBOROUGH, Mass. – Quarterback Tom Brady, LT Matt Light, G Logan Mankins, LB Jerod Mayo, CB Devin Mc-Courty, S Brandon Meriweather, WR Wes Welker and DL Vince Wilfork have been selected to represent the New England Patriots and the AFC in the 2011 Pro Bowl on Jan. 30 at Aloha Stadium in Hawaii. Brady, Mankins and Wilfork were selected

as starters, while Mayo, McCourty and Meriweather were selected as reserves and Light and Welker

were added as alternates.



Brady finished the 2010 season with 3,900 yards passing and an NFL-leading 36 touchdowns. He extended his streak to 355 consecutive pass attempts without an interception to set an NFL record, eclipsing Bernie Kosar's record of 308 pass attempts. Brady has reached 30 touchdown passes for the second time in his career and is one of just 13 NFL players since the 1970 merger to have at least two 30-touchdown seasons. He also set an NFL record with at least two touchdowns and no interceptions in nine straight games, passing Don Meredith's (1965-66) previous record of six straight games. Brady was named AFC Offensive Player of the Week twice in 2010 following back-to-back four-touchdown efforts in wins at Detroit (11/25) and vs. the New York Jets (12/6).

**Light** has been part of eight division championships, four conference titles and three Super Bowl crowns since joining the Patriots as a second round draft pick out of Purdue in 2001. He has helped the New England offense finish in the Top 10 on offense six times, including a streak of four straight seasons in the Top 10.

Mayo earned his first Pro Bowl berth after an NFL-leading 193 total tackles, including two 19-tackle games: vs. Baltimore (10/17) and vs. Green Bay (12/19). His 193 total tackles are the third-best in team history. A first-round pick in 2008, Mayo registered 139 tackles that season and joined Mike Haynes (1976) as the second Patriots player to win the Associated Press Defensive Rookie of the Year Award. The defensive co-captain had 10 10-tackle games in 2010 and has had three straight 100-tackle seasons.

Mankins is going to his third Pro Bowl and his second consecutive. He went to his first Pro Bowl in 2007 when he became the first Patriots guard to earn a Pro Bowl selection since 1985 when Pro Football Hall of Famer John Hannah went to his ninth career Pro Bowl. Mankins joins Hannah as the only Patriots guards to earn Pro Bowl bids since the 1970 merger. The Fresno State product is in his sixth season with the Patriots since being selected in the first round (32nd overall) of the 2005 NFL Draft. He started nine games this season and has never missed an NFL game, starting all 89 games of his career.

McCourty is the fourth Patriots rookie to be selected to the Pro Bowl, joining Mike Haynes (1976), John Stephens (1988) and Curtis Martin (1995). McCourty, a first-round pick in 2010, started all 16 games and finished the season tied for second in the NFL with seven interceptions. The seven interceptions by a Patriots rookie are second to the eight by Mike Haynes in 1976. McCourty finished third on the team with 83 total tackles. He has also recorded seven interceptions for 110 yards, one sack, 17 passes defensed, two forced fumbles and 12 special teams tackles.

Meriweather is headed to his second consecutive Pro Bowl. He finished the 2010 season with 66 total tackles and three interceptions. He leads all current Patriots with 12 career interceptions. Meriweather intercepted a Peyton Manning pass on Indianapolis' first drive of the game and returned it 39 yards to put the Patriots in scoring position in a 31-29 victory on Nov. 21.

Welker returned from a season-ending knee injury well ahead of schedule and led the Patriots with 86 receptions for 848 yards. The 86 receptions tied for sixth best in the NFL. Welker became the first Patriots player to lead the team in receiving four straight seasons in 2010. Since joining the Patriots in 2007, Welker leads the NFL with 432 receptions.

Wilfork earned his third Pro Bowl berth after leading the Patriots defensive line with 87 total tackles. Since being selected in the first round (21st overall) of the 2004 draft out of Miami, Wilfork has helped the Patriots defense finish in the top 10 on four occasions (2004, 2005, 2007 and 2008). He recorded a season-high 10 total tackles in the Patriots' 23-20 overtime win vs. Baltimore on Oct. 17. The Patriots have an 82-24 (.774) record in Wilfork's 106 regular season games. Wilfork was selected by his teammates as a defensive co-captain in 2010 for the third straight season.
