THIS WEEK'S PREVIEW

As the Cardinals look to keep pace in the NFC West and continue their push for a playoff spot in 2020, the team embarks on the final stretch of the regular season with a trip to New England this week.

Sunday's game marks the Cardinals sixth all-time road game in New England where they hold a 3-2 record.

This is the 15th all-time matchup between the Cardinals and Patriots in a series that dates back to 1970. The teams split the previous 14 meetings 7-7. After the Cardinals posted a 6-1 record in their first seven games against the Patriots, New England has a 6-1 record in the last seven matchups.

The last two games between the Cardinals and Patriots were each decided by two points and both came down to missed FG attempts.

At Gillette Stadium on Sunday, Arizona head coach **Kliff Kingsbury** will face - for the first time - the team and coach who drafted him nearly two decades ago. Long-time Patriots head coach **Bill Belichick** selected Kingsbury in the sixth round (201st overall) of the 2003 NFL Draft out of Texas A&M.

Also squaring off for the first time are Cardinals QB Kyler Murray and Patriots QB Cam Newton. Two of the 23 individuals in history to have won the Heisman Trophy and been selected #1 overall in the NFL Draft - the duo is among the more uniqué talents the league has ever seen. They were the only rookies in NFL history to throw for 3,500+ yards and run for 500+ yards and they are also the only two QBs in league annals to have accumulated 6,000+ passing yards and 1,000+ rushing yards in their first 25 career games. This season, both Murray (10 rushing TDs) and Newton (9 rushing TDs) are making a run at the latter's 2011 NFL record for rushing TDs by a QB (14).

Two current Cardinals have significantly more experience against the Patriots. Both RB Kenyan Drake (w/ Miami) and WR DeAndre Hopkins (w/ Houston) spent the majority of their careers in the AFC prior to coming to Arizona and together have faced New England 13 times. Drake's history against the Patriots includes one of the NFL's most memorable plays of the past decade: a 69-yard pass play as time expired vs. New England on 12/9/18 to give Miami a 34-33 win. On the desperation lateral play, Drake was credited with the game-winning 52-yard TD reception. It was the last TD Drake scored prior to joining the Cardinals last year.

One long-time Cardinal has had success against the Patriots in his limited action against the franchise. WR Larry Fitzgerald has three TD catches in four career games against New England, including a pair of TD grabs in the last meeting (Week 1 of the 2016 season.

Following this week's game, Arizona returns home to host the Rams in the first of three games against division opponents in the final five weeks of the regular season.

#AZVSNE - WEEK 12 HIGHLIGHTS

- With the teams having split the first 14 meetings between them 7-7, the Cardinals look to gain an advantage in their all-time series against the Patriots when they travel to Gillette Stadium on Sunday.
- Cardinals head coach **Kliff Kingsbury** who was selected by New England in sixth round of the 2003 NFL Draft faces his former team and the coach who drafted him (Bill Belichick) for the first time on Sunday.
- · Currently a game back of both the Seahawks and Rams in the NFC West, Arizona will look to improve to 7-4 when they take on the Patriots this Sunday.
- · Arizona brings its high-powered offense to New England this week. The Cardinals rank #1 in the NFL in total offense (414.3 ypg) and #7 in scoring (28.7 ppg) in 2020. Arizona also features the NFL's #2 ranked rushing attack (157.7 ypg) and leads the NFL in rushing TDs (16) and rushing average (5.15).
- AZ's Kyler Murray (10) and NE's Cam Newton (9) rank #1 and #2 in rushing TDs among QBs in 2020. Both are making a run at Newton's 2011 singleseason record for rushing TDs by a QB (14).
- Cardinals CB Byron Murphy Jr. and Patriots WR N'Keal Harry selected one pick apart in the 2019 NFL Draft - are close friends dating back to their days as high school standouts in Arizona. They were teammates at Marcos de Niza High in Tempe as sophomores before each transferred. There was a time during that sophomore year when Harry lived with Murphy and his family.
- Playing a season-high 45 snaps on defense last week in Seattle, Cardinals rookie LB Isaiah Simmons finished with a team-high 10 tackles, his first career sack, two tackles for loss and a QB hit.
- THANKSGIVING THROWBACK: The NFL's oldest record which has now stood for 91 years - is the <u>40 total points</u> (6 TD; 4 PAT) scored by Cardinals Hall of Famer **Ernie Nevers** on Thanksgiving Day in 1929 vs. the Chicago Bears. The six TDs also remain tied for the NFL single-game record.

Kliff Kingsbury became an NFL head coach for the first time when he was hired by the Cardinals on January 11, 2019, coming to Arizona after six seasons (2013-18) as the head coach at his alma mater, Texas Tech. Now in his second season in Arizona, Kingsbury has the Cardinals off to a 6-4 start, their best since 2015. The team also features the NFL's #1 ranked offense and second-year QB Kyler Murray has entered the MVP conversation. Known for his work with QBs in the college ranks, Kingsbury helped guide Murray, the #1 overall pick in the 2019 draft, to AP NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year honors last season. While at Texas Tech, Kingsbury served as the play-caller for one of college football's most explosive offenses that ranked in the top-20 in total offense all six seasons. A former star QB at Texas Tech, Kingsbury was drafted by the Patriots in the sixth round of the 2003 NFL Draft and also spent time with the Saints and Jets during his playing career.

Named the Patriots head coach on January 27, 2000, Bill Belichick is in his 21st season at the helm in New England in 2020. This season also marks Belichick's 46th consecutive season as a coach in the NFL, the longest con-Belichick's 46th consecutive season as a coach in the NFL, the longest continuous streak in league history. He has led the Patriots to an NFL record 19 consecutive winning seasons, six Super Bowl titles, nine conference championships, 17 division titles and 31 postseason victories. His 31 postseason wins and six Super Bowl titles are both NFL records for a head coach, and his 12 total Super Bowl appearances are the most among any head coach or assistant coach in league annals. Since entering the NFL in 1975, Belichick's coaching career has believed produce eight Super Bowl titles. 12 conference coaching career has helped produce eight Super Bowl titles, 12 conference championships and 24 division titles. A former center/tight end at Wesleyan, Belichick began his NFL coaching career in 1975 with the Baltimore Colts.

A FORMER PUPIL BECOMES A PEER

"More than anything, you just feel gratitude and you feel honor just to be on the field with the best coach of all time." - Kliff Kingsbury on facing Bill Belichick and the Patriots in Week 12.

When the Cardinals travel to New England this week to face the Patriots, Arizona head coach Kliff Kingsbury will face - for the first



time - the coach who drafted him nearly two decades ago. Long-time Patriots head coach Bill Belichick drafted Kingsbury in the sixth round (201st overall) of the 2003 NFL Draft out of Texas A&M. An injury forced Kingsbury to spend his lone season with the Patriots on injured reserve but during that time he learned to look at the game from a coach's point of view.

"With that team, each and every day - it didn't matter if it was a preseason game or an offseason practice - you were going to be prepared," Kingsbury said of his time under Belichick. "You were going to know what was going on. That's why he's had such great success. That would be the biggest thing I took from him, was watching his work ethic and the level of preparation that he put his team through.

In was during that rookie season - breaking down video with then-Patriots offensive coordinator Charlie Weis and the rest of the New England assistants - that the seeds of Kingsbury's coaching career were planted. And this week, 17 years after being drafted by the Patriots, Kingsbury returns to New England for the first time as an NFL head coach.

ALL-TIME SERIES

Sunday's game between the Cardinals and the Patriots represents the 15th alltime matchup between the two teams in a series that dates back to 1970. The teams split the previous 14 meetings 7-7.

After the Cardinals posted a 6-1 record in their first seven games against the Patriots, New England has a 6-1 record in the last seven matchups.

It was in the Cardinals last visit to Gillette Stadium - in Week 2 of the 2012 season - that Arizona earned its lone victory its last seven games and snapped a five-game losing streak in the series.

The last two games between the Cardinals and Patriots were decided by two points and both came down to missed FG attempts at the end of regulation. At New England in 2012, Arizona won 20-18 after the Patriots potential 42yard game-winning FG attempt sailed wide left with 0:05 remaining. The last time the teams met was in Week 1 of the 2016 season, when the Patriots inched out a 23-21 victory when Arizona's potential game-winning 47-yard FG attempt missed wide left with 0:41 remaining in regulation.

This week's game marks the Cardinals sixth all-time road game in New England, where they hold a 3-2 record.

A LOOK BACK AT THE LAST VISIT TO FOXBOROUGH
With their 20-18 victory over the Patriots in Week 2 of the 2012 season, the Cardinals handed New England their first-ever loss in a home opener at Gillette Stadium. Before losing to Arizona, the Patriots had a perfect 10-0 record in home openers at the venue, which opened in 2002. It remains one of just two losses (2017 vs. KC) for the Patriots in 19 all-time home openers at Gillette Stadium.

With the win in New England, the Cardinals snapped a five-game losing streak to the Patriots and earned the team's first win in New England since 1984 (33-10). It was the first victory against the Pats since a 24-10 victory in Arizona

The Cardinals win marked the Patriots 14th loss at Gillette Stadium. Then-Pats QB Tom Brady entered the contest with a 35-1 record in his previous 36 home

Arizona handed Pats head coach Bill Belichick his first loss to a team from the NFC West since the realignment in 2002.

GOOD FRIENDS SQUARE OFF

Cardinals CB Byron Murphy Jr. and Patriots WR N'Keal Harry were selected one pick apart in the 2019 NFL Draft. Harry was the final pick in the first round (32nd overall to New England) while Murphy was the first pick of the second round (33rd ovérall to Arizona).

The two are good friends dating back to their days as high school standouts in Arizona. While Murphy finished his prep career at Saguaro High in Scottsdale and Harry at Chandler High, they were previously teammates at Marcos de Niza High in Tempe as sophomores.

Harry - a native of the Caribbean island of Saint Vincent - moved to Arizona with his grandmother

at the age of four. There was a time during that sophomore year when he lived with Murphy and his family. "They truly are like brothers," Murphy's mother, Shannon Strickland, told the Seattle Times in a feature story about the duo prior to a face off between Washington and ASU in 2018. "We are family."

ARIZONA PRODUCTS ABOUND IN THIS CONTEST

Murphy and Harry are not the only Arizona products that will be featured in Sunday's game at Foxborough. Both the Cardinals and Patriots rosters consist of a number of players who starred at either the high school or college level in the Valley.

#1 vs. #1 - A RARE MATCHUP

When Cardinals QB Kyler Murray faced Dolphins QB Tua Tagovailoa in Week in 9, it was the first time ever that two starting QBs each wearing jersey #1 squared off.

With Murray and Pats QB Cam Newton facing off this week in Foxborough, it will now have happened twice in the span of four . weeks.

- TWO UNIQUE TALENTS ON THE FIELD THIS SUNDAY
 As a rookie in 2019, Kyler Murray threw for 3,722 yards and rushed for 544 yards. He became just the second rookie in NFL history with 3,500+ passing yards and 500+ rushing yards in a season. The other: Cam Newton in 2011
- Murray threw for 308 and 349 yards in his first two games as a rookie, joining Newton (2011) as the first two QBs in NFL history to throw for 300+ yards in their first two career games (Chargers QB Justin Herbert became the 3rd in 2020).
- In Week 10 vs. Buffalo playing in his 25th career game Murray surpassed 6,000 career passing yards. He became just the second player in NFL history with 6,000+ passing yards and 1,000+ rushing yards in their first 25 career games. The other: Cam Newton (2011-12).

Receiving yards for Hopkins in 2020, which leads the NFL. Hopkins ranks third in receptions (72) this season, trialing only the Chargers Keenan Allen (81) and Buffalo's Stefon Diggs (73).

Tackles for rookie LB Isaiah Simmons last week vs. Seattle, a season high. Simmons finished the game with a team-high 10 tackles, his first career sack, two tackles for loss and a QB hit in 45 snaps.

Rushing TDs for RB Kenyan Drake in 17 career games with the Cardinals. Dating back to the final three weeks of the 2019 season, Drake has 12 rushing TDs in his last 12 games played.

RUSHING AVERAGE ABOVE RECORD PACE

After finishing #32 in the NFL in both rushing yards and rushing average in 2018 the Cardinals finished the 2019 season having averaged over 5.0 yards per rush attempt as a team for the first time in franchise history. Arizona averaged a franchise-record 5.03 yards per rush attempt last season.

Through 10 games in 2020 the Cardinals are averaging 5.15 yards per rush attempt, putting them on pace to break the franchise record set in 2019.

A RARE NINE IN A ROW WITH 100+ RUSHING YARDS

The Cardinals rushed for 100+ yards in each of the first nine games this season, a streak that was snapped last week in Seattle. The 2020 season marked just the second time (1984) in the last 60 years (1961-20) that the Cardinals rushed for 100+ yards in each of the first nine games of a season.

RUNNING FOR 150 & 200 UNDER KINGSBURY

The Cardinals have rushed for 150+ yards in 11 of 26 games under Kingsbury. Arizona had seven such games in the three seasons (2016-18) prior to his arrival. The Cardinals are 9-2 when rushing for 150+ yards over the last two seasons.

Arizona has rushed for 200+ yards in a game five times under Kingsbury, including twice this season. The Cardinals had 200+ rushing yards in a game just five times in the previous 15 seasons combined (2004-18) prior to Kingsbury's arrival.

LONG DISTANCE RUSHING TOUCHDOWNS

RB **Kenyan Drake** had a 69-yard rushing TD in Week 6 at Dallas giving Arizona four rushing TDs of 20+ yards in 2020 (QB **Kyler Murray** - 2; RB **Chase Edmonds** - 1). That is the most in the NFL this season.

DRAKE LEADING CARDS RUSH ATTACK

The Cardinals rushing attack in 2020 is led by RB **Kenyan Drake** who has a team-high 641 yards and five TDs on 146 carries (4.4 avg.) in 2020. Despite missing Arizona's Week 9 contest vs. Miami due to injury, the fifth-year pro is on pace for his first career 1,000-yard season.

AN ARIZONA SUCCESS STORY

Drake scored his fifth rushing TD of the season on a two-yard run last week vs. Seattle. It was Drake's 13th rushing TD in 17 games played with Arizona. Dating back to the final three weeks of the 2019 season Drake has 12 rushing TDs in his last 12 games played.

In Week 10 vs. Buffalo Drake posted a game-high 100 rushing yards on 16 carries (6.3 avg.). It was his seventh career 100-yard rushing performance and his fifth with Arizona. SIMMONS HAS BIG GAME IN SEATTLE

Cardinals 2020 first-round draft pick LB Isaiah Simmons - taken #8 overall by Arizona in April had the best game of his young career last week in Seattle. Playing a season-high 45 snaps on defense the former Clemson standout finished with a team-high 10 tackles, his first career sack, two tackles for loss and a QB hit.

After not playing more than 21 snaps in the first seven games this season Simmons has seen his role grow significantly over the last month and he has made his present felt. In the last four games he has played 114 snaps and recorded 19 tackles, an INT, a sack, three tackles for loss, a pass defensed and two QB hits.



In the Cardinals thrilling victory over Seattle in Week 7 came up with the play that led to Arizona's game-winning FG in OT. With Arizona having just missed a potential game-winning FG Seattle took over on the ensuing possession and with just over a minute remaining in OT they faced a 3rd-n-14 at their own 48-yard line. Russell Wilson attempted a pass over the middle to Tyler Lockett that Simmons intercepted and returned 12 yards to the SEA 49-yard line. Six plays later – with just 0:15 remaining – the Cardinals kicked the game-winning 48-yard FG.

CARDS BRING IN PEKO

On Monday the Cardinals announced the signing of DL Domata Peko Sr. (pronounced 'doe-MAH-tah PECK-oh'). Now in his 15th season in the NFL, Peko was a fourth round pick (123rd overall) by the Bengals in the 2006 NFL Draft.

A native of Pago Pago, American Somoa, Peko played his first 14 seasons with Baltimore (2019), Denver (2017-18) and Cincinnati (2006-2016). Below are some of the highlights of his NFL career.

• Totaled 599 tackles, 39 tackles for loss, 20.0 sacks, 49 QB hits, two forced fumbles, five fumble recoveries and 14 passes defensed in 208 games (189 starts) before joining the Cardinals.

WR **DeAndre Hopkins** has been as good as advertised in his first season with the Cardinals, who acquired the three-time 1st-team All-Pro in the offseason in a trade with Houston.

Through 10 games, Hopkins has 72 receptions for 912 yards and four TDs.

Hopkins' 43-yard game-winner against the Bills was the first go-ahead Hail Mary in the 4th quarter since 12/3/15 when Green Bay QB Aaron Rodgers threw a game-winning 61-yard TD to TE Richard Rodgers as time expired to give the Packers a 27-23 victory over Detroit.

It also marked the first time the Cardinals won a game on a TD pass on the final scrimmage play of regulation since Josh McCown's 28-yard TD pass to WR Nate Poole as time expired on 12/29/03 vs. Minnesota. That TD gave the Cards an 18-17 win and knocked the Vikings out of postseason contention on the final day of the regular season.



The win over Seattle gives the Cardinals a .617 win percentage (27-16-4) in their 47 overtime contests. That is the best OT winning percentage in NFL history.

KIRK HEATING UP IN THE DESERT

Through nine games this season, third-year WR Christian Kirk has 31 catches for 477 yards and a career-high six TDs, putting him on pace for career highs in both receiving yards and TDs.

Kirk's most recent TD catch was a 56-yarder against Mjami in Week 9. It was his sixth TD reception of 2020, giving him as many TD catches in nine games played this season (missed Week 3 due to injury) as he had in his first two NFL seasons (2018-19) combined (6).

CHRISTIAN'S LONG-DISTANCE TD CATCHES of Kirk's 12 career TD receptions, five have covered 50+ yards. Most recently, Kirk had an 80-yard TD catch against the Cowboys on Monday Night Football in Week 6 and the 56-yard TD

reception vs. Miami.

UNDER THE RADAR BREAKOUT SEASON

With much of the attention focused on All-Pro wideouts Larry Fitzgerald and DeAndre Hopkins - Kirk is quietly posting a breakout season in 2020, in which he leads the team with six TD catches.

But for anyone who saw Kirk play in his first two NFL seasons, it was easy to see the talent the local product possessed. In his first two seasons after being draft by Arizona, Kirk piled up 111 receptions for 1,299 yards and six TDs despite missing seven games due to injury.

<u>ONLY ANQUAN WAS FASTER TO 100</u> Playing in his 22^{nd} career game in Week 14 vs. Pittsburgh last season, Kirk reached 100 receptions for his career. In franchise history, the only player to have 100 catches in fewer games was Anguan Boldin (16)

AWARDS COME POURING IN

WR DeAndre Hopkins was named the "NFC Offensive Player of the Week" following his now-famous 43-yard Hail Mary TD grab over three Bills defenders in the Cardinals 32-30 win vs. Buffalo in Week 10.

It is just the second "Player of the Week" award for Hopkins, who also earned the honor in 2015 (Week 6) with Houston.

In the win over the Bills, Hopkins caught seven passes for 127 yards, including a 43-yard game-winning TD with just 0:02 remaining in regulation. It was Hopkins fourth career game-winning TD catch in the fourth quarter/OT and the first to come with under a minute left on the clock.

It is the Cardinals fourth "Player of the Week" selection this season and third "Offensive Player of the Week" award. The three "Of-fensive Player of the Week" awards are the most the Cardinals have had in a single season since 1996 (four).

MURRAY AND BAKER CLEAN UP IN OCTOBER

The Cardinals piled up the awards in the month of October. S **Budda Baker** was named "NFC Defensive Player of the Month" for October and QB **Kyler Mur-**ray was named "NFC Offensive Player of the Week" for his Week 7 performance vs. Seattle.

Between Murray and Baker, the duo combined for three consecutive "Player of the Week" awards (Weeks 5-7) and one "Player of the Month" award all of which came in October.

It is just the fourth time (2015, Weeks 14-16; 2014, Weeks 8-10; 1998, Weeks 15-17) in team history that the Cardinals have had "Player of the Week" winners <u>in three straight weeks.</u>

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE MONTH (OCTOBER) - S BUDDA BAKER

Baker was named the "NFC Defensive Player of the Month" for his performance in October, marking the first time in his career he has earned the honor.

He finished the month of October with 31 tackles, 2.0 sacks, 2 INTs (90 return yards), 3 TFL, 3 QB hits, 2 PD and a FF in three games played - all Arizona victories. He played all three games with a cast on his thumb after having surgery which forced him to miss Arizona's Week 4 game at Carolina.

Baker became the first NFL player in the last seven seasons (2014-20) to record at least 30 tackles, 2.0, 2 INTs and a FF in a single calendar month.

He was the only player in the NFL with multiple sacks and multiple INTs in October and his 31 tackles ranked second among all NFL DBs.

OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK - KYLER MURRAY (WEEKS 5 & 7)
Murray was named the "NFC Offensive Player of the

Week" for his performance against the Jets in Week 5 and vs. the Seahawks in Week 7. With his two "Offensive Player of the Week" selections in 2020, he has now earned the honor three times in his career. He joins Kurt Warner (5x) and Neil Lomax (4x) as the only QBs in team history with at least three "Offensive Player of the Week" selections.

Murray also became the first Cardinals QB to be named "Player of the Week" twice in the same season since Warner in 2009.

WEEK 7 VS. SEATTLE: Murray completed a career-high 34-of-48 pass attempts (70.8%) for 360 yards, 3

TDs and a 104.5 passer rating. He also added 67 rushing yards and a TD on 14 carries. He became the first player in NFL history to throw for 350+ yards and 3+ TDs while also rushing for 50+ yards and a TD in a single game

WEEK 5 AT NY JETS: Murray completed 27-of-37 pass attempts (72.9%) for a career-high 380 yards, a TD and a passer rating of 103.4. He also ran for 31 yards and a TD on nine carries. His 380 passing yards led the NFL in Week 5 and were also the most passing yards by a Cardinals QB in a win since Carson Palmer threw for 419 yards in a 27-14 victory at Jacksonville in 2013.

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK - S BUDDA BAKER (WEEK 6 AT DALLAS) Baker earned his first career "Defensive Player of the Week" after recording 7 tackles, a sack, his first career INT, a tackle for loss, two QB hits, a pass defensed and a forced fumble in the Monday night victory over the Cowboys.

He became the first Cardinals player since 2003 (Renaldo Hill on 11/2 vs. Cincinnati) to record a sack, an INT and a forced fumble in the same game

EDMONDS CHASES 1,000

RB Chase Edmonds has 315 rushing yards on 64 carries (4.9 avg.) and 297 receiving yards on 36 receptions (8.3 avg.) so far in 2020. He also has four total TDs (1 rushing; 3 receiving).

With 612 yards in 2020, Edmonds has already established a career high for scrimmage yards in a season. He needs 388 yards over the final six games (64.7 ypg) to reach 1,000 scrimmage yards for the first time in his career.

Fitzgerald's streak of 253 consecutive games with a catch is the longest in NFL history with a single team, and he has at least one catch in 259 of 260 career games played.

His streak began in Week 9 of his rookie season in 2004 at Miami and continued exactly 16 years and 12 days later.

Fitzgerald is one of just eight players in NFL history with 10+ TD receptions in the postseason. Of those eight, only Fitzgerald (9) has played in fewer than 15 career playoff games. Only Hall of Fame WRs Jerry Rice (22 in 29 games) and John Stallworth (12 in 17 games) plus Bucs TE Rob Gronkowski (12 in 16 games) have more TD receptions in the postseason.

In fact, Fitzgerald's career numbers already surpass all but one receiver currently in the HOF (Rice). He has more career receptions than 28 of the 29 receivers in the HOF: Swann (336), Hayes (371), Pihos (373), Lavelli (386), Hirsch (387), Fears (400), Warfield (427), McDonald (495), Mitchell (521), Stallworth (537), Alworth (542), Biletnikoff (589), Carmichael (590), Berry (631), Maynard (633), Taylor (649), Irvin (750), Joiner (750), Lofton (764), Largent (819), Monk (940), Reed (951), Moss (982), Owens (1,078), Bruce (1,024), Brown (1,094), Carter (1,101) and Harrison (1,102).

He has more career receiving yards than 28 of the 29 receivers in the HOF: Fears (5,397), Swann (5,462), Pihos (5,619), Lavelli (6,488), Hirsch (7,029), Hayes (7,414), Mitchell (7,954), McDonald (8,410), Warfield (8,565), Stallworth (8,723), Biletnikoff (8,974), Carmichael (8,985), Taylor (9,110), Berry (9,275), Alworth (10,266), Maynard (11,834), Irvin (11,904), Joiner (12,146), Monk (12,721), Largent (13,089), Reed (13,198), Carter (13,899), Lofton (14,004), Brown (14,934), Harrison (14,580), Bruce (15,208), Moss (15,292) and Owens (15,934).

A Career Full of Accomplishments:

- •Franchise career leader in receptions (1,421), receiving yards (17,419), receiving TDs (120), total TDs (120) and 100-yard receiving games (49). His nine 1,000-yard seasons are also a franchise record. His reception and receiving yardage totals both rank second in NFL history behind Jerry Rice while his 120 receiving TDs rank sixth in league annals.
- •Led the NFL with 107 receptions in 2016, marking the second time in his career (103 in 2005; tied with Steve Smith) he had done so. He became the first player in NFL history to lead the NFL in receptions at least 11 years apart. Prior to Fitzgerald, the longest span between leading the league in receptions was six by Jerry Rice (1990, 1996).
- •Led the NFL in receiving TDs in both the 2008 (12) and 2009 (13) seasons. In addition to his 10 receiving TDs in 2007, he became the first player in franchise history to record at least 10 TDs in three consecutive seasons.
- Fitzgerald (11) joins Hall of Famer Jerry Rice (13) as the only wide receivers in NFL history to be named to the Pro Bowl at least 11 times.
- •Fitzgerald had more receptions in his first 200 career games (1,116) than any player in NFL history.
- •One of just seven players in NFL history to record at least 1,400 receiving yards in a season four times in their career: Jerry Rice (6), Julio Jones (5), Randy Moss (4), Marvin Harrison (4), Antonio Brown (4) and Andre Johnson (4).

- One of three players in NFL history with at least 600 receptions, 8,500 yards and 50 TDs in his first seven seasons (Marvin Harrison; Torry Holt).
- In NFL history, only Marvin Harrison (665) had more receptions in his first seven NFL seasons than Hopkins (632).

In league history, only Hall of Famer Marvin Harrison (665) had more receptions in his first seven NFL seasons than Hopkins (632).



ELEVATING A FRANCHISE

The 2020 season is the 14th since owner **Michael Bidwill** began leading the organization. His leadership during that time has been instrumental in transforming the franchise both on and off the field.

Highlights of Bidwill's tenure:
• Leading the list of Bidwill's accomplishments with the Cardinals is the creation of State Farm Stadium. In the first 14 seasons after opened in 2006, the team sold out all 144 games (preseason and postseason included) played at the world-class venue that has been awarded three Super Bowls.



- In addition to his role in helping Arizona land Super Bowls XLII and XLIX, he led the effort to land Super Bowl LVII (2023) in the spring of 2018. Michael was instrumental in getting the 2015 Pro Bowl moved to Arizona, which was played a week before Super Bowl XLIX, and the two events combined to deliver a record economic impact of \$720 million to the region.
- By the time it hosts Super Bowl LVII, State Farm Stadium will have undergone \$100 million in improvements including parking infrastructure, state-of-the-art wifi, video boards, sound system upgrades and club-area enhancements since it staged Super Bowl XLIX.
- Of the Cardinals seven all-time postseason wins, five have come with Bidwill leading the team. Arizona has played in nine postseason contests over the last 13 seasons, after playing just seven prior to his tenure as team president.
- AZ has appeared in the NFC Championship Game twice since 2008, including a victory in the 2008 conference title game that led to the team's first-ever Super Bowl appearance (Super Bowl XLIII).
- In January of 2018, Michael was one of five owners named to the NFL's Player-Owner Committee focused on social and racial justice initiatives. In December of 2014, Commissioner Roger Goodell tapped Bidwill to chair the league's Conduct Committee.
- In January of 2019, Michael received the Paul Tagliabue Award from the Fritz Pollard Alliance for demonstrating integrity and leadership in the area of career development for minorities and advocating for diversity.

KEIM HAS BUILT SOME OF THE BEST

Steve Keim was promoted to GM on January 8, 2013 after 14 seasons in the Cardinals organization. The team has experienced unprecedented success during his tenure as GM. The teams put together by Keim have been some of the most successful in franchise history.





Arizona won 13 games and earned its first-ever postseason bye.

- During Keim's tenure, Arizona has established franchise records for wins in a season (13 in 2015), points in a season (489 in 2015), led the NFL in total offense for the first time in team history (#1 in 2015) and led the NFL in sacks for the second time ever (48.0 in 2016).
- Selected QB **Kyler Murray** with the #1 overall pick in the 2019 NFL Draft. Murray was named the NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year following a recordsetting season.
- Among the trades negotiated by Keim during his tenure as GM are the acquisition of QB Carson Palmer from Oakland in 2013, acquiring LB Chandler Jones from New England in 2016 and the trade that landed WR DeAndre Hopkins from Houston in 2020. During the 2019 season, Keim also orchestrated a trade with Miami for RB Kenyan Drake.
- Arizona has featured a top-10 defense four times and a top-10 offense twice dating back to Keim's first season as GM. The Cardinals had a top-10 defense in three consecutive seasons (2015-17) for the first time since the 1970 merger.
- Named Sporting News 2014 NFL Executive of the Year and earned back-toback NFL Executive of the Year honors from Pro Football Talk (2013-14).

CARDINALS TAKE PART IN PUSH FOR JUSTICE

Throughout the 2020 season, Cardinals players and coaches are joining the rest of the NFL in honoring and memorializing victims of systemic racism and showing their support for Social Justice efforts by displaying names or phrases as decals on the back of their helmets and patches on their caps.



The season-long effort highlights the actions being taken to reach solutions, engages fans to act and gives players and coaches a platform on gameday to share their voice and efforts to inspire change. Together, the NFL is joining its players and coaches in building awareness, educating fans and paying homage to those who deserve to have their legacies live on.

Numerous Cardinals players spoke up about their own experiences and the importance of making meaningful change a reality in the United States.

OL Kelvin Beachum - 11/20/20

OL Kelvin Beachum participated in an NFL-produced video "Say Their Stories" and discussed Breonna Taylor specifically:

"Saying her name is not just a slogan that we're putting on the back of our helmets. It's more than that. It's a rallying cry for Black women all across America, to realize how special she is and how special she was.

DL Corey Peters - 8/28/20

DL Corey Peters spoke about how important it is that everyone engage in the conversations and understand other viewpoints:

"One thing we want to do is be sensitive to one another, have compassion for one another, and we can disagree with certain things peacefully and all work towards the same goal of not only winning but make this a better country for everybody.

OL D.J. Humpries - 8/28/20

OL **D.J. Humphries** spoke about his children being a major motivator in trying to help bring about change:

"I know how to accept what the world has for you. I know how to maneuver in this world. But for my children, that's not what I want. I want my children to grow up in a fair world and grow up in a world where what the Constitutions only it really it." tion says is how it really is.

<u>Head Coach Kliff Kingsbury - 8/27/2020</u> Kingsbury talked about what the Cardinals players and coaches have been discussing and learning from each other during recent events across the country:

"I had a great conversation with my dad over the summer, and his perspective on things that was really valuable as we get closer to the season – the anthem, discussions and things of that nature.

"My dad was a longtime football coach but also a Marine. He served in Vietnam, received a Purple Heart. Talking to him, there were two words that really stood out. One was respect, and the second thing was understanding. Respect viewpoints people have on this topic. They're very per-sonal and very passionate. And respect their right to express themselves.

"You've got to understand, at its core, what this is really about. It's always been about drawing attention to the social injustice that continues to take place. We saw it again this week with Jacob Blake. It's about increasing awareness that racism exists, police brutality against people of color continues to happen, and let's not confuse it with something else and make the narrative different.

"My biggest takeaway from talking to my dad is that kneeling doesn't reflect a lack of patriotism or respect for the military in any way, just like standing during the anthem doesn't mean you're OK with racism or social injustice. It's important to respect and understand that. These are important issues that need to be addressed, and important conversations that need to be had. I'm grateful that I've been able to be around a great group of guys that have enlightened me – hearing their stories and their struggles. Those conversations will continue throughout the year. I just hope we can all continue to push in the right direction."

QB Kyler Murray - 6/17/20 Following the death of George Floyd and the resulting protests around the country, Murray spoke the change he saw happening in real time:

There is a lot of hate in this world, but at the same time, what's happening and what we're seeing right now, it's huge. I don't condone rioting and stuff like that, but the peaceful protests, I think they're great, they're amazing. Whether it takes years, I feel like we're getting there. At least we're making a step towards it."

• Six-time team captain (2013, 2015-18, 2020) has totaled 461 tackles, 28 INTs (one returned for a TD) and 113 passes defensed in 148 games (all starts) during his first 10 NFL seasons. The Cardinals selected CB **Patrick Peterson** with the fifth pick in the 2011 NFL Draft, and in his first nine seasons, he earned eight Pro Bowl selections and was named first-team All-Pro three times. Considered one of the game's best cover corners, he has proven to be one of the most unique talents in NFL history. Since his rookie season in 2011, only three NFL players have more INTs than Peterson.

Hicks is tied for the sixth-most INTs among all active NFL LBs, and he has played the second-fewest games (69) among those in the top-10.

KIRKPATRICK HAS TWO PICKS FOR THE CARDS

Through nine games with the Cardinals, CB **Dre Kirkpatrick** has two INTs, his most in a single season since the 2016 campaign when he had three. In the Week 10 game against Buffalo, he stepped in front of a Josh Allen throw with 4:38 remaining in the fourth quarter.

His first pick as a Cardinal came against his former Bengals teammate, QB Andy Dalton, in the Monday Night Football win over Dallas in Week 6. It was his fourth INT in eight career MNF appearances. Among active players, only New England CB Devin McCourty (5 in 12 games) has more INTs while playing on MNF.

Kirkpatrick signed with the Cardinals soon after the start of training camp, joining the team after eight seasons in Cincinnati, where DC Vance Joseph was his position coach during the 2014-15 seasons.

ACCOMPLISHED VET JOINS THE SECONDARY

In Week 10, the Cardinals signed CB Johna**than Joseph**, a two-time Pro Bowl selection who is in his 15th NFL season in 2020.

In his career, Joseph has played 209 games (192 starts) and has 779 tackles (662 solo), 32 INTs, 8 forced fumbles, 5 fumble recover ies and 199 passes defensed. He has scored 8 TDs in his career (7 INT return; 1 fumble return).

The 36-year old Joseph entered the league with Cincinnati as a first-round selection (24th overall) in the 2006 NFL Draft out of South Carolina and spent his first five seasons in the league with the Bengals before signing as a free agent with Houston in 2011 where he played the next nine seasons.



Now with the Cardinals, Joseph reunites with defensive coordinator Vance Joseph who was his position coach in Houston between 2011-13.

Below are a few facts about Joseph's career:

• His 32 career INTs rank 3rd among active players behind only Richard Sherman (35) and Tramon Williams (34)


TRADING THE DEEP FRYER FOR A GAME BALL

The only game ball given out following the Cardinals Week 5 victory over the Jets went to third-year LB Dennis Gardeck - adding a new chapter in the inspiring story the former undrafted rookie authored on his way to the NFL playing field.

Playing the first defensive snaps of his career, Gardeck – a special teams captain who signed with the Cardinals as a rookie free agent out of the University of Sioux Falls in 2018 – finished the game against the Jets with 2.0 sacks in just 10 defensive snaps.

His second quarter sack of Jets QB Joe Flacco was his first sack since his senior year at Sioux Falls in 2017.

It was a big performance for the Lake of the Hills, IL native but it wasn't the first success he has experienced in the NFL.



A SMALL SCHOOL STANDOUT AND FAST FOOD STAR

Gardeck's path to the NFL didn't run through a blue-chip college. Following high school, he attended Division II West Virginia State University for three seasons before spending his final college season at Sioux Falls as a graduate transfer. He was a standout in college though.

He recorded 345 tackles, 32.0 sacks, 57.5 tackles for loss, nine forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries in four seasons and was named to five Division II All-America teams as a senior in 2017.

He kept himself busy off the field during his college days as well. He earned a degree from West Virginia State (Gardeck is currently studying for a Masters of Business Administration degree) while also working at McDonald's. He started out on the grill crew but "worked his way up" to the assembly table and fryars. "It feels weird saying it was a good fit, but I had a blast there," he said. "I loved it. I loved my coworkers


ALL-PRO HOPKINS HAPPY FOR HIS TRAINING PARTNER

Following the win over the Jets, WR **DeAndre Hopkins** spoke of how happy he was to see Gardeck's hard work paying off. "I rehabbed and trained with Dennis this offseason before I came here and I saw the work that he put in. I got to see the work he put in behind the scenes and for him to go in do what he did today, I knew he was going to give his all and it resulted in two sacks. That is what you look for in a guy like that. It gives the team motivation.

LEE STILL ON TOP OF HIS GAME

Now in his 17th NFL season - and fourth with the Cardinals - P Andy Lee is still one of the league's most productive punters. Since joining the Cardinals in 2017, Lee ranks third in the NFL with a 47.4-yard gross punting average.

KICKING HIS WAY TO THE TOP

Since joining the Cardinals in 2018, K Zane Gonzalez has connected on 53-of-63 FG attempts, including 20 consecutive FGs between Weeks 5-16 of the 2019 season.

The ASU product matched a career high with four made FGs in the Week 10 win over Buffalo and made three-of-four FG attempts in the Week 7 win over the Seahawks on SNF.

He connected on a 44-yarder as time expired in regulation to send the Seahawks game into OT and a 48-yarder to win it in OT, marking the third game-winning kick of his career and the first to come in OT. He also had game-winners at Green Bay in 2018 and in Cincinnati in 2019.



ZANE FROM LONG RANGE

He has converted two-of-three from beyond 50 yards this season, including a 54-yard FG in Week 3 against the Lions and a career-long 56-yarder in Week 1 against the 49ers.

In franchise history, just three made FGs have covered more ground than his 56-yard FG against San Francisco.

CARDINALS COVID-19 RELIEF EFFORTS (TEAM INITIATIVES)

Since the COVID-19 pandemic hit the country earlier this year the effects of the outbreak have reached every corner of the U.S. and has had a devastating impact on citizens and businesses across the nation. The Cardinals organization – along with the players and staff – immediately mobilized to donate time, money and other resources throughout Arizona to assist the individuals, businesses, schools, frontline health care personnel and other organizations that have been so greatly affected by the crisis.

LION FOUNDING CONTRIBUTION TO THE AZ CORONAVIRUS RELIEF FUND

On March 24, the Cardinals made a \$1 million founding contribution to the AZ Coronavirus Relief Fund. As part of the Arizona Together initiative launched earlier that day by Governor Doug Ducey, the fund was set upestablished to provide financial support to organizations working to mitigate the impacts of COVID-19 in Arizona. Initially, it focused on the following immediate needs:

- Funding of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) for frontline medical personnel.
- Non-profit organizations that support the most vulnerable Arizonans through food banks, homeless shelters, domestic violence facilities, and other services
- Providing disadvantaged students with the technology necessary to transition to online learning.

"Like so many in our community, this unprecedented crisis has us asking what we can do to help and what might have the greatest impact," said Cardinals Owner **Michael Bidwill** said of the donation. "We are grateful for the creation of this relief fund, are proud to support its critically important mission and hope that others throughout the community can join this effort in whatever way that they are able. As a team, we will continue to work on additional ways to make a difference and know that as a community we will get through this challenging time together.'

To assist local businesses during the crisis, the Cardinals made a \$100,000 donation to Local First Arizona, Arizona's Coronavirus Micro Grant Fund





In early April, the Cardinals and State Farm partnered on an historic initiative to address a pressing local need arising from the COVID-19 pandemic. The number of people seeking assistance from local food banks more than doubled as a result of the unparalleled crisis. Unfortunately, the number of donations to them decreased just as dramatically.

As part of their on-going commitment to improve the local community, State Farm and the Cardinals helped tackle the issue by donating over a million 1,000,000 meals that were distributed to five non-profit organizations throughout the Valley. The five groups involved in the "Million Meal" donation were:

- St. Mary's Food Bank
- St. Vincent DePaul
- United Food Bank
- Phoenix Rescue Mission Midwest Food Bank

ORGANIZATION LAUNCHES "CARDINALS CARRY-OUT" INITIATIVE TO ASSIST INDEPENDENT, LOCALLY OWNED RESTAURANTS



On April 13 the team launched "Cardinals Carry-out" - an unprecedented initiative with a dual purpose: assist independent, locally-owned restaurants hit hard by the coronavirus crisis and recognize those working on the front lines of the pandemic in the medical community, law enforcement and emergency services.

Cardinals players and fans nominated their favorite establishments for inclusion on the team's interactive statewide map and supported them with take-out business.

In the spirit of the NFL Draft, the team selected establishments from the map each day and purchased meals which were delivered to nurses, doctors, first responders and others who work daily to combat the impact of COVID-19.

When it was launched, the first 47 establishments on the map reflected the favorites of Cardinals players and staff as well as those near area hospitals suggested by Local First Arizona. Within the first week, over 800 restaurants throughout the state have been added based on recommendations from fans.

"It's great that a major sports team would put together such a thing that is community driven and helps restaurants navigate these tough times...we're kind of in survival mode but we're going to make it out," said **Chris Hove**, owner of Perfect Pear Bistro in Chandler which was recommended by defensive lineman Zach Allen.

HOSTING CRITICAL BLOOD DRIVES, DRIVE-THROUGH TESTING AND PPE DRIVES AT STATE FARM STADIUM One area hit particularly hard by the COVID-19 crisis was the local blood donation community,

where the supply reached critically low levels during a crucial time in March. In a seven-day span between March 19 and March 26, nearly 200 blood drives in Arizona were cancelled, resulting in the loss of more than 5,000 blood donations for hospital patients.

To assist in meeting this direly pressing need, the Cardinals partnered with Dignity Health and Cigna to host a major one-day blood drive at State Farm Stadium. In conjunction with Scottsdale-based Vitalant (pronounced "vye-TAL-ent" and formerly known as United Blood Services) the event took place at State Farm Stadium on March 31. All donation slots for the drive were filled within hours of the event being announced.

The outpouring of support from the community resulted in two additional blood drives being scheduled at State Farm Stadium. On back-to-backs on April 7-8, in conjunction with the American Red Cross, the Cardinals partnered with Anheuser-Busch to host blood drives at State Farm Stadium and all donation slots were again filled.

On April 15, the Cardinals and Project C.U.R.E hosted a Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) drive at State Farm Stadium. The event was to help collect equipment for use by those in the local

healthcare community, including eye protection, face shields, surgical masks, N95 masks, gloves, shoe covers and hand sanitizer.

In May, the Cardinals and Dignity Health partnered to participate in the state's drive-through COVID-19 testing blitz by hosting events open to the public at State Farm Stadium.

CARDINALS COVID-19 RELIEF EFFORTS (PLAYER INITIATIVES)

KLIFF KINGSBURY – \$50,000 DONATION TO THE NAVAJO RELIEF FUND (NRF)

The Native American population in Arizona was hit particularly hard by the COVID-19 outbreak and the Cardinals head coach was among the many who stepped up to help. In April, Kingsbury donated \$50,000 to the Navajo Relief Fund to assist one of the communities that was most affected – the Navajo Nation. The NRF was established to help with the shortage of healthy food, safe drinking water, healthcare and supply stores in remote reservation communities. During the pandemic, the fund served as urgent need in making available food, water and other basic supplies.

DEANDRE HOPKINS - \$150,000 DONATION TO THE ARIZONA CORONAVIRUS RELIEF FUND; #THEREALHEROES PROJECT It didn't take long for the All-Pro wideout to make a significant impact in Arizona. On

March 27, 2020 - just a week after being acquired by the Cardinals -- Hopkins announced a \$150,000 donation to the AZ Coronavirus Relief Fund, which was established to provide financial support to multiple organizations trying to deal with the impact of COVID-19. Money raised by Arizona Relief Fund goes to purchasing Personal Protective Equipment for medical personnel working with the coronavirus patients; supporting non-profits that aid the most vulnerable such as food banks, homeless shelters and domestic violence facilities; and providing technology for disadvantaged students needed for online learning.

Hopkins was among the sports stars who participated in a national project to recognize and celebrate health care workers for their efforts on the front lines of the coronavirus pandemic. "The Real Heroes Project" was a collaboration involving Hopkins and athletes from a combined 14 leagues. Others include New Orleans Saints QB Drew Brees, New York Yankees All-Star outfielder Aaron Judge, U.S. women's soccer stars Carli Lloyd and Alex Morgan, and Hockey Hall of Famer Wayne Gretzky. In the PSA – which was released on National Nurses Day - Hopkins recognized local nurse Tracy Thomas, an RN at Dignity Health St. Joseph's Hospital and Medical Center. She was selected in recognition of the incredible work she has done leading the COVID-19 Response



CHANDLER JONES – DONATED 150,000 MEALS TO FOOD BANKS IN ARIZONA AND NEW YORK
In late March, the Cardinals All-Pro LB donated over 150,000 meals to food banks in both Arizona and his hometown of Endicott, NY to assist with families affected by the Coronavirus outbreak. Jones provided meals to St. Mary's Food Bank and Midwest Food Bank of Arizona while also donating to Mother Teresa's Cupboard through the Catholic Charities of Broome County in New York.

JORDAN HICKS — \$100,000 TO IMPACT CHURCH COVID-19 RELIEF EFFORTS; ANIMAL ADOPTION INITIATIVE
Following a career year on the field in his first season with Arizona, Hicks joined his wife, Ivana, to announce in April that they would match and donate up to \$100,000 to their church in Scottsdale – Impact Church – to assist single mothers during the pandemic. Those efforts included providing meals and helping cover rent and mortgage payments. Hicks' donation also helped facilitate a COVID-19 drive-through testing initiative at the church that saw over 500 people receive free tests.

Hicks and his wife also organized an animal adoption campaign in Austin that saw 260 animals adopted in under a week. The couple partnered with Austin (TX) Pets Alive to provide new pet owners with a care package that included a crate, pet food, treats, a leash and a toy.

KYLER MURRAY — \$25,000 DONATION TO GENYOUTH FOR ITS COVID-19 EMERGENCY SCHOOL NUTRITION FUND
With schools across the country closed because of the coronavirus, the reigning NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year stepped up in April to help children who counted on school meals to be fed on a daily basis. He donated \$25,000 to GENYOUth for its COVID-19 Emergency School Nutrition Fund, which was established to provide resources that allowed school meal programs to continue despite school closures.

<u>ISAIAH SIMMONS – DONATED 60,000 MEALS TO HARVEST COMPASSION CENTERS IN ARIZONA</u>
Within a week of becoming the #8 overall pick in the 2020 NFL Draft, the former Clemson star was already reaching out to help people in Arizona struggling as a result of the pandemic. Simmons teamed up with the Cardinals and Bose to donate 60,000 meals to the Harvest Compassion Center for its facilities in Phoenix, Maryvale and Chandler. Harvest Compassion Center is a food and clothing bank dedicated to providing a hope-filled environment to the underserved in the greater Phoenix area. HCC locations offer free food, hygiene, baby, home and clothing items to the many Arizonans living below the poverty line.

LARRY FITZGERALD – DELIVERING MEALS TO HEALTHCARE WORKERS AND FRONTLINE STAFF

One of the most prolific WRs in NFL history, Fitzgerald long ago set the standard for making an impact in the community – and those efforts continued duringto the COVID-19 outbreak. In late April, he teamed with Steak 44, Ocean 44 and Dominick's to deliver meals to healthcare workers all over the Valley. In addition to helping those who have gone above-and-beyond to serve the community during the pandemic, it also served as a very personal cause for Fitzgerald, who's late mother, Carol, was a nurse.

COREY PETERS – STARTED VIRTUAL BOOK CLUB FOR ARIZONA HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

A passionate advocate for reading, the Cardinals starting DT set up an in-person book club a few years ago. When the pandemic hit, forcing the closure of schools and the enforcement of social distancing, Peters saw an opportunity to make the book club virtual. So in May, he launched the virtual book club "The Corey Peterson Playbook" to help provide an educational outlet for all Arizona high school students during the COVID-19 crisis.

PATRICK PETERSON – DONATED TO ARIZONA FIRST RESPONDERS ON MEMORIAL DAY WEEKEND
With Memorial Day occurring in the middle of the pandemic, the Cardinals All-Pro helped keep the spirit of the holiday when he teamed with Pit Boss Grills to donate grill products and gift cards to Arizona first responders. Peterson had his followers on social media nominate a first responder of their choice and he selected three winners on Memorial Day who each received a new top-of-the-line grill, grilling products and a gift card from Bashas supermarket.

DEVON KENNARD - DELIVERED MEALS TO FOUR VALLEY FIRE DEPARTMENTS; VIRTUAL HOSPITAL VISITS

In May, Arizona native – and Cardinals 2020 free agent signing – Kennard gave back to his hometown when he teamed with Salad and Go to provide dinner for firefighters at dour different fire stations in the Ahwatukee area.

Every year Cardinals players and staff make numerous visits to Phoenix Children's Hospital to lift the spirits of the children and their families in pediatric units. Due to COVID-19 and the resulting safety restrictions, those visits have taken a new form. In late August, Kennard became the first Cardinals player to take the controls of a telepresence robot in order to spend time with children at PCH. While Kennard was at training camp at State Farm Stadium, he was able to drive the robot through the halls of PCH and interact with children through a video monitor.









CARDINALS PLAYER NOTES - OFFENSE

QUARTERBACKS

Brett Hundley – Chandler native and 2009 Arizona Gatorade Player of the Year. Packers 2015 fifth-round pick out of UCLA, spent his first four NFL seasons with Green Bay (2015-17) and Seattle (2018) before joining Arizona in March 2019.

Kyler Murray – Fourth player in NFL history with 7,000+ total yards (pass & rush) and 50+ total TDs in his first 25 career games (Patrick Mahomes, Kurt Warner and Deshaun Watson). Won the 2018 Heisman Trophy, selected first overall in the 2019 NFL Draft and earned AP NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year honors.

Chris Streveler – Played 35 games in two seasons (2018-19) with the Winnipeg Blue Bombers of the Canadian Football League where he threw for 2,698 yards and 19 TDs and ran for 1,167 yards and 22 TDs before signing with Arizona in February.

RUNNING BACKS

Eno Benjamin – Drafted by the Cardinals in the seventh round (222nd overall) of the 2020 NFL Draft out of Arizona State. Selected in nearly the same spot as the last ASU player drafted by the Cardinals – S Pat Tillman (226th overall) in 1998.

Kenyan Drake – Miami's third-round pick (73rd overall) in the 2016 NFL Draft joined Arizona in a trade last year. Ranks sixth in the NFL with 1,284 rushing yards and tied for fifth with 13 rushing TDs since joining the Cardinals in Week 9 last season.

Chase Edmonds – Cardinals fourth-round pick (134th overall) in the 2018 NFL Draft out of Fordham has 1,702 all-purpose yards in 39 career games (four starts) for Arizona. Five of his seven-career rushing TDs have been 20+ yards.

Jonathan Ward – Joined the Cardinals as an undrafted rookie free agent from Central Michigan, where he had 2,539 yards and 28 TDs on 473 carries in 42 games. Played each of the last eight games after starting the season on the practice squad.

TIGHT ENDS

Dan Arnold – Wisconsin-Platteville product played 12 games (2018-19) for the Saints after entering the league as a rookie free agent in 2017. Has 23 catches for 310 yards and three TDs in 13 games (five starts) since joining Arizona in 2019.

Darrell Daniels – Washington product entered the NFL as a rookie free agent with the Colts and was claimed by Arizona in 2018. Has played 43 games (12 starts) for the Cardinals (2018-20), Seahawks (2018) and Colts (2017).

Maxx Williams – Baltimore's 2015 second-round pick (55th overall) joined Arizona on a one-year deal in 2019 and signed a two-year extension through 2021. Has a career 81 receptions for 732 yards and five TDs in 62 games (34 starts).

WIDE RECEIVERS

Larry Fitzgerald – Ranks second in NFL history with 17,419 receiving yards and 1,421 receptions, the most catches by an NFL player with a single team. One of 10 receivers named to the NFL 100 All-Time Team, joining nine Pro Football Hall of Fame inductees as the only active player in the group.

DeAndre Hopkins – Four-time Pro Bowl (2015; 2017-19) and three-time first-team All-Pro (2017-19) selection ranks third in receptions (704), second in receiving yards (9,514) and second in TD catches (58) since entering the league in 2013.

Andy Isabella – Arizona's 2019 second-round pick (62nd overall) out of UMass was a consensus first-team All-American as a senior. Has 24 receptions for 373 yards and three TDs in 25 games (one start) for the Cardinals.

KeeSean Johnson – Arizona's 2019 fifth-round pick (174th overall) out of Fresno State, where he set a program record with 3,463 career receiving yards. Has 24 catches for 216 yards and one TD in 12 games (four starts) for Arizona.

Christian Kirk – Arizona's 2018 second-round pick (47th overall) became the second-fastest player in franchise history to reach 100 career receptions (22 games). Has 142 receptions for 1,776 yards and 12 TDs in 34 career games (28 starts).

Trent Sherfield – Third-year player out of Vanderbilt has 24 catches for 296 yards and a TD in 39 games (three starts) after signing with the Cardinals as an undrafted free agent in 2018.

OFFENSIVE LINE

Kelvin Beachum – Selected by Pittsburgh in the seventh round (248th overall) of the 2012 NFL Draft and started 99 of 104 games played with the Steelers (2012-15), Jaguars (2016) and Jets (2017-19) before signing with the Cardinals in July.

Mason Cole – Cardinals third-round pick (97th overall) in the 2018 NFL Draft out of Michigan has played 39 games (25 starts) during his first three years in the league. Has started 23 games at center, including all 16 as a rookie, and two at LG.

Lamont Gaillard – Cardinals 2019 sixth-round pick (179th overall) out of Georgia, where he started all 42 games and earned first-team All-SEC in 2018. Made his NFL debut in Week 1 and started at center in Weeks 2-3 for an injured Mason Cole.

Max Garcia – Signed with the Cardinals as a free agent in 2019. Has played 74 games (41 starts) with Denver (2015-18) and Arizona (2019-20) after being selected by the Broncos in the fourth round (133rd overall) of the 2015 NFL Draft out of Florida.

D.J. Humphries – Cardinals first-round pick (24th overall) in the 2015 NFL Draft out of Florida, re-signed a three-year contract with Arizona in February. Has started all 53 games he has played during his NFL career, including all 26 at LT since last season.

Josh Jones – Drafted by Arizona in the third round (72nd overall) of the 2020 NFL Draft out of Houston, where he started all 45 games he played at LT in four seasons (2016-19) for the Cougars. Has played seven games this season.

Josh Miles – Selected by Arizona with its first pick in the seventh round (248th overall) of the 2019 NFL Draft out of Morgan State, becoming the second player from the program drafted since 1983. Played seven games during his rookie campaign.

Justin Murray – Entered the NFL as a rookie free agent with Denver in 2016 and signed a two-year contract extension with Arizona in October. Has played 22 games (15 starts) for the Cardinals since being claimed off waivers last season.

Justin Pugh – Started all 96 games he has played with the Giants (2013-17) and Cardinals (2018-20) since entering the league as a first-round pick (19th overall) in the 2013 NFL Draft. Signed a five-year contract with Arizona before the 2018 season.

J.R. Sweezy – Entered the league with Seattle has a seventh-round selection (225th overall) in the 2012 NFL Draft and has played 111 games (101 starts) with the Seahawks (2012-15, '18), Buccanneers (2016-17) and Cardinals (2019-20).

De'Vondre Campbell – Atlanta's 2016 fourth-round pick (115th overall) signed a one-year contract with the Cardinals after posting a career-high 129 tackles and three forced fumbles in 2019. Has 67 tackles in 10 games (all starts) for Arizona.

Kylie Fitts – Chicago's sixth-round pick (181st overall) in the 2018 NFL Draft out of Utah has played 18 games (one start) for the Bears (2018) and Cardinals (2019-20). Joined Arizona's practice squad in Week 1 during the 2019 season.

Dennis Gardeck – Signed with the Cardinals as a rookie free agent out of Sioux Falls in 2018, named a Pro Bowl alternate on special teams in 2019 and voted a team captain before the 2020 season. Had 2.0 sacks in 10 plays during the first defensive snaps of his NFL career against the Jets in Week 5.

Markus Golden – Arizona's second-round pick (58th overall) in the 2015 NFL Draft out of Missouri has appeared in 72 games (43 starts) for the Cardinals (2015-18) and Giants (2019-20). Returned to Arizona in a Week 7 trade with New York.

Haason Reddick – Former Temple walk-on was Arizona's first-round pick (13th overall) in the 2017 NFL Draft and has played all 58 games (25 starts) in his first four seasons. Has a single-season career-high 5.0 sacks through 10 games this year.

Isaiah Simmons – Eighth overall pick in the 2020 NFL Draft out of Clemson, where he was a unanimous first-team All-American and the Butkus Award winner as the nation's top LB. Had 10 tackles, two tackles for loss and 1.0 sack against Seattle in Week 11.

Ezekiel Turner – Signed with Arizona as an undrafted rookie free agent out of Washington. Led the NFL with 13 solo tackles on special teams in 2018 and has 39 special teams tackles in 38 career games for the Cardinals.

Tanner Vallejo – Buffalo's 2017 sixth-round (195th overall) pick out of Boise State has played 49 games with Arizona (2019-20), Washington (2019), Cleveland (2018) and Buffalo (2017). Joined the Cardinals practice squad in Week 12 last season.

Budda Baker – Arizona's 2017 second-round pick (36th overall) out of Washington signed a four-year contract extension during training camp. Earned NFC Defensive Player of the Month and Week honors as well as being named a team captain this season.

Chris Banjo – Eighth-year NFL veteran has played 97 games (four starts) with Arizona (2019-20), New Orleans (2016-18) and Green Bay (2013-16). SMU product has career highs in starts (two) and tackles (23) in eight games this season.

Johnathan Joseph – Two-time Pro Bowler (2011-12) and Bengals 2006 first-round pick (24th overall) out of South Carolina played 207 games (192 starts) with Tennessee (2020), Houston (2011-19) and Cincinnati (2006-2010) before joining Arizona in Week 10.

Dre Kirkpatrick – Bengals 2012 first-round pick (17th overall) out of Alabama played 99 games (67 starts) with Cincinnati before signing a one-year contract with Arizona. Had 288 tackles, 10 INTs and 65 passes defensed in his first eight NFL seasons.

Byron Murphy Jr. – Arizona's 2019 second-round pick (33rd overall) out of Washington earned first-team All-America and first-team All-Pac 12 honors his junior season. Has recorded 112 tackles (94 solo) and 14 passes defensed in 25 games (22 starts).

Patrick Peterson – Eight-time Pro Bowler is sixth in franchise history and ranks third among active NFL defenders since 2011 with 28 career INTs. Fifth overall pick in the 2011 NFL Draft out of LSU has started all 148 games he has played.

After an offseason unlike any other in the league's long history, NFL teams were back in action. For the Cardinals, that meant a trip to San Francisco to face the defending NFC Champion 49ers at Levi's Stadium. Arizona emerged with a 24-20 victory, earned its first Week 1 win since 2015 and first Week 1 road victory since 2010. Making his Cardinals debut was WR DeAndre Hopkins, the All-Pro wideout acquired via offseason trade with Houston. And what a debut it was, as the five-time Pro Bowl selection went on to establish a career high with 14 receptions while adding 151 receiving yards. Second-year QB Kyler Murray did a little of everything in the win, throwing for 230 yards and a TD and also rushing for 91 yards and another score. Arizona's defense and special teams also played vital roles, with the defense coming up with a pair of game-changing stands.

On the game's opening series the 49ers covered 41 yards and six plays to set a up a Robbie Gould 52-yard FG for a 3-0 lead. On the first play of the next SF series, RB Raheem Mostert made it 10-0 when he took a short pass over the middle 76 yards for a TD. The Cards D forced a punt on the next 49ers possession and on it LB Ezekiel Turner broke through the middle and blocked the kick which LB Dennis Gardeck recovered at the SF 15-yard line. On the very next play, the Cardinals scored their first TD of the season on Murray's 10-yard pass to RB Chase Edmonds out of the backfield. San Fran looked poised to expand its lead later in the half after driving to the AZ 1-yard line. On 4th-n-1, Mostert attempted a run up the middle but was stuffed by LBs Devon Kennard and De Vondre Campbell. Arizona was unable to capitalize on its next two possessions, which saw K Zane Gonzalez miss a 52-yard FG attempt and Murray throw an INT inside AZ territory. San Francisco capitalized on the INT, taking a 13-7 lead five plays later on a 24-yard Robbie Gould FG. With just 30 seconds remaining in the half. AZ drove 37 yards on 6 plays on a 20-yard Edmonds run and two Murray-to-Hopkins completions. It set up a career-long 56-yard FG by Gonzalez as the half expired that cut the Niners lead to 13-10.

Neither team scored in the third quarter which set up a back-and-forth final frame that featured three TDs. Arizona took its first lead of the game early in the fourth on a 14-play 94-yard drive. On it, Murray and Hopkins connected three times for 32 yards and Murray capped it with a 22-yard TD run to give AZ a 17-13 lead. SF answered on its next possession, driving 78 yards in 6 plays and re-taking the lead on a 5-yard Garoppolo to Jerrick McKinnon TD pass. Arizona came right back to take a 24-20 lead on the ensuing possession, going 75 yards on 9 plays. Facing a 3rd-n-6 at the SF 34-yard line, Murray connected on a short pass to Hopkins and the All-Pro wideout appeared to score on a catch-n-run but the initial TD ruling was overturned on review and the ball was ruled down at the 1-yard line. RB Kenyan Drake finished the drive on the next play, running in for his 9th TD as a Cardinal.

Holding a four-point lead, it came down to another crucial stop by the AZ defense to seal the win. San Francisco took over at its own 25-yard line with 5:00 remaining and moved downfield. With under a minute remaining, SF faced 3rd-n-5 at the AZ 16-yard line when Garoppolo attempted a pair of passes to WR Trent Taylor. The third down attempt was batted down by second-year CB Byron Murphy Jr. in the end zone. The fourth down sideline pass would have been enough for a first down but was again batted down by a diving Murphy.

Following a week 1 road win over San Francisco, the Cardinals returned to State Farm Stadium for their home-opener vs. Washington. An all-around stellar outing from QB Kyler Murray and stingy game by the Cardinals defense led to a 30-15 AZ victory as the team moved to 2-0 for the first time since 2015. Murray rushed for a pair of long TDs while connecting with WR DeAndre Hopkins for an early score. Arizona's defense held Washington scoreless in the first half as the Cards took a 20-0 lead into intermission. The Cards offense put up 438 total yards of offense in the win, including 160 yards on the ground. AZ had four different players post 50+ receiving yards - Hopkins (68), Andy Isabella (67), Christian Kirk (57) and Larry Fitzgerald (50) - and two different players rush for 60+ yards - Kenyan Drake (86) and Kyler Murray (67).

In a reversal of Week 1, it was the Cardinals who got off to a fast start on both sides of the ball. AZ's defense forced a 3-n-out on the opening series and the offense took over inside WAS territory. The Cards then went 48 yards in 10 plays and Murray capped it with a 4-yard TD toss to Hopkins, the WR's first TD in an AZ uniform. Following a WAS punt on the next possession, Murray was intercepted by WAS S Landon Collins at the AZ 20-yard line. The Cards defense stepped up, as newcomer Jordan Phillips sacked Haskins forcing a fumble that Chandler Jones recovered at the AZ 12. Although the Cards were forced to punt on the ensuing series, the special teams unit came up with its second big play of the season, forcing a fumble by WAS returner Steven Sims which was recovered by LS Aaron Brewer at the WAS 40-yard line. AZ closed the opening quarter with a six-play drive that Murray ended with his 14-yard TD run that gave AZ a 14-0 lead. After another WAS 3-n-out, AZ increased its lead to 27-0 with a 49-yard FG by Zane Gonzalez. The Cards tacked on a 33-yard Gonzalez FG on their next possessions as the first half ended with a 20-0 AZ lead. On its six first half possessions, the Cards D held WAS to five punts and a fumble while totaling just 98 total yards.

The teams came out of halftime and traded punts early in the third quarter before WAS crossed midfield for the first time on a 10-play, 51-yard drive that resulted in a Dustin Hopkins 34-yard FG. With their lead cut to 20-3, AZ responded on its next drive, going 75 yards on 12 plays as Murray scored his third rushing TD of the season on an electrifying 21-yard run to extend the lead to 27-3. WAS mounted a comeback in the fourth quarter as QB Dwayne Haskins threw 24 and 11-yard TD passes on consecutive possessions to narrow AZ's lead to 27-15 after both two-point conversion attempts failed. With 6:38 remaining, the Cards took over and went 74 yards on an 11-play drive that consumed 6:12 and resulted in a 28-yard Gonzalez FG for the final 30-15 tally.

Recap
Detroit kicker Matt Prater nailed a 39-yard FG as time expired to give the Lions a 26-23 road win and hand Arizona (2-1) its first defeat of the season. The Cardinals outgained Detroit in total yards (377-322) but were hindered by three turnovers and came up with none themselves. Arizona WR DeAndre Hopkins continued his torrid start to the season, catching 10 passes for 137 yards while fellow wideout Andy Isabella caught a pair of TD passes from Kyler Murray. The second-year QB also scored on a dazzling 1-yard run and became just the 3rd signal-caller in league history with rushing TDs in each of the season's first three games.

Prater and the Lions struck first with a 37-yard FG on the game's first possession. The Cards appeared poised to respond when they reached the DET30 on the ensuing drive but Murray's third down pass deflected off the hands of TE Dan Arnold and was intercepted by S Duron Harmon. AZ forced a Lions punt and when the Cards offense got the ball back, Murray went 6-6 passing; the last of those was an arcing 13-yard TD toss that dropped perfectly to Isabella in the back corner of the end zone. When LB Devon Kennard ended the next DET drive with a sack of former teammate Matthew Stafford, the Cardinals had a chance to add to their lead But LB Jamie Collins stepped in front of a Murray pass intended for WR Larry Fitzgerald and the Lions took over at the AZ27. They faced a 4th-n-goal at the 5 when Stafford hit TE Jessie James for a TD that put the Lions up 10-7 with 6:15 left in the second quarter. Murray completions of 18 and 11 yards to Hopkins and an 11-yarder to Arnold helped the Cards move quickly into DET territory. On 3rd-n-3 from the 16, Murray hit RB Chase Edmonds on a shallow cross that took it to the 1. The next play saw the QB zig-zag to his left and elude defenders on his way to a TD run that put AZ up 13-10 with 1:53 before intermission. That would be enough time for Detroit as Stafford led the Lions 75 yards in 6 plays and re-took the lead with a 15-yard scoring strike to Kenny Golladay that made it 17-13 with :31 left in the first half.

Arizona pulled to with in a point at 17-16 on its opening drive of the third quarter when Zane Gonzalez nailed a 54-yard FG. The next Cards possession ended when rookie CB Jeff Okudah picked off a Murray pass and returned it to the AZ22. That takeaway led to a 24-yard Prater FG that made it 20-16 Lions. Murray and the Cardinals would bounce right back and re-claimed the lead thanks to an 11-play, 75-yard TD drive. On it, Murray connected with Hopkins 4 times for 58 yards, ran for 13 on a 3rd-n-5 and capped it with a 4-yard TD pass to Isabella. A Corey Peters sack of Stafford helped end the next DET drive but the ensuing punt pinned the Cards at their own 2. After an AZ 3-n-out, the Lions got the ball back at the Cards 36 leading to a 35-yard game-tying FG from Prater with 6:44 to go. Arizona's next possession reached midfield but ended there and after an Andy Lee punt, DET took over at its own 9 with 4:49 to play. A pair of Golladay catches covered 22 yards and a Marvin Jones completion gained 20, putting the Lions in position for Prater's game-winner as the clock struck zero.



Recap
The Cardinals fell to 2-2 on the season with a road loss at Carolina. Panthers QB Teddy Bridgewater threw a pair of TDs and ran for another against an Arizona defense that was missing three safeties, including All-Pro Budda Baker. Cards signal-caller Kyler Murray completed 24 of 31 passes and threw three TD passes himself in the losing effort.

Carolina Panthers 14

The Panthers jumped out to a 14-0 lead with touchdowns on each of their initial two drives. On the first, they converted a key 4th-n-2 as well as a 3rd-n-10 before RB Mike Davis capped the 13-play, 66-yard drive by running it in from a yard out. On the next AZ series, Murray just missed WR Andy Isabella deep down the left sideline on 3rd-n-3 from the Cards 32. The ensuing Panthers drive saw them move 80 yards in 9 plays and on 3rd-n-8 from the 18, Bridgewater scrambled and weaved thru the middle of the field for a 1D. Early in the 2nd quarter, CB Patrick Peterson picked off Bridgewater at the near sideline to set the offense up at the Carolina 38. Murray then completed 5 straight passes including a 3-yard TD to TE Jordan Thomas that made it 14-7. The Panthers answered with another long TD drive (10 plays, 75 yards) and this one ended when Bridgewater hit RB Reggie Bonnafon out of the backfield for a 3-yard score that made it 21-7 at intermission

The Cards opening drive of the 3rd quarter reached the Carolina 38 but the threat ended when Murray's arm was hit while attempting to pass. Initially ruled incomplete, replay reversed it to a fumble that the Panthers recovered at their own 26. From there, Carolina moved 74 yards in 8 plays and Bridgewater ended it with a 2-yard TD toss to TE Ian Thomas that made it 28-7. On the next play from scrimmage, Murray scrambled 48 yards to the CAR27; it was the longest run by a Cards QB since 1958 and 3rd longest ever. Six plays later Murray hit WR Christian Kirk with a 3-yard TD pass to make it a 2-score game late in the 3rd quarter. But the next Panthers drive not only added 3 points to their lead on a Joey Slye field goal, but chewed 8:30 off the clock by running 15 plays. The game's final points came when Murray and RB Chase Edmonds connected on a 2-yard TD with 2:13 left that made it 31-21.

Recap
The Cardinals moved to 3-2 with a 30-10 win over the Jets at the Meadowlands. After dropping the previous two games, Arizona rebounded to post season highs with 496 total yards of offense and 28 first downs. QB Kyler Murray threw for a career-best 380 yards while WR DeAndre Hopkins eclipsed 130 receiving yards for the 3rd time in five games with the Cardinals (6-131-TD). The Cardinals were bolstered by the return of one All-Pro defender – safety Budda Baker who returned after a one-game absence (thumb) – but lost another in the 2nd quarter when LB Chandler Jones exited with a bicep injury. Seeing his first career action on defense, special teams captain Dennis Gardeck recorded the first two sacks of his career.

Arizona opened the scoring on its 2nd possession of the game. On it, Murray was 4-4 passing for 41 yards and ran once for 16 yards in moving the Cards to the NYJ29. On 3rd-n-1 from there, he handed off to RB Chase Edmonds who raced off the right side for his 4th TD in 2 career games at MetLife Stadium. On the Jets' 1st possession of the 2nd quarter they reached the AZ13 where they were turned away on both 3rd-n-1 and 4th-n-1. Arizona's ensuing drive ended when Murray's 3rd down pass was tipped at the line and intercepted by LB Avery Williamson who returned it 25 yards to the AZ10. But the Cards defense allowed just 2 yards and forced the Jets to settle for a 26-yard Sam Ficken FG that trimmed the lead to 7-3. On the next series, AZ moved 75 yards in 10 plays that included back-to-back 24-yard completions to WRs Andy Isabella and Christian Kirk; Murray capped the drive when he ran it in from 2 yards out for his 5th rushing TD of the season. Up 14-3, the defense appeared to recover Jet fumbles twice on the next series but replay reviews ruled otherwise. Nonetheless, Gardeck's 1st career sack halted the drive, and AZ's offense took over at its own 19 with :53 left in the first half and one timeout. Murray marched the Cards into position for a 47-yard Zane Gonzalez field goal. On that drive he completed all four passes (excluding a spike that stopped the clock) for 52 yards including 3 for 46 to Edmonds.

Midway thru the 3rd, Jets QB Joe Flacco – who started the game in place of the injured Sam Darnold – hit WR Jamison Crowder with a 52-yard completion that moved it to the AZ22. Four plays later the two connected on an 11-yard TD score that trimmed AZ's lead to 7. The Cardinals' next drive saw them face a 4th-n-1 from their own 39 with 3:49 left in the third and they chose to go for it; on a play action pass, Murray found TE Darrell Daniels who hauled it in for a career-long 31-yard gain to the NYJ30. The extended possession ended with three straight Kenyan Drake runs, the last of which found the end zone from a yard out and put AZ up 24-10 late in the 3rd quarter. If that Cards drive was a counterpunch, the next one delivered the knockout. Murray moved the team 96 yards, 82 of which came on two passes to Hopkins. The first was a deep ball down the left sideline that Hopkins hauled in for a spectacular 45-yard gain to the AZ11 to the NYJ44. Five plays later, AZ was at the NYJ37 when Murray launched it to the goal line where Hopkins' one-handed grab provided the game's final points in brilliant fashion.

RECAP

The Cardinals improved to 4-2 with a convincing 38-10 win at Dallas on Monday Night Football. It was the team's 1st road win on MNF since 1977 and third ever, all vs. the Cowboys. Including high school (5-0) and college (1-0), QB Kyler Murray upped his all-time record as a starter at AT&T Stadium to 7-0, running for one score and passing for two – both to WR Christian Kirk. The Cards offense rushed for 261 yards and scored 38 points – both season bests – but it was the defense that led the way. Playing its first game without All-Pro pass rusher and captain Chandler Jones, that unit came up with 4 takeaways that led to 3 TDs and a FG. All-Pro safety Budda Baker was all over the field, coming up with an INT, a fumble recovery and a sack. DT Jordan Phillips forced an Ezekiel Elliott fumble and recovered another while LB Haason Reddick recorded a pair of sacks.

The game was scoreless late in the 1st quarter when the AZ defense made the first of several game-changing plays. Making his 1st start in place of injured QB Dak Prescott, Andy Dalton dumped it off to Elliott out of the backfield but Baker sniffed it out and forced a fumble that Phillips recovered at the AZ46. The Cards moved to the DAL6 in 10 plays, including a 11-yard Murray run on 4th-n-1 at the 18. The QB then flipped it to Kirk on an end around and the 6-yard score made it 7-0 early in the 2nd. Two snaps later, Phillips forced another Elliott fumble and CB Byron Murray's recovery set the offense up at the DAL27. AZ soon faced a 3rd-n-11 at the 28 when Larry Fitzgerald's catch and stretch moved the chains with an 11-yard gain. A 16-yard Murray scamper then took it to the 1 and RB Kenyan Drake punched it in from there to put AZ up 14-0 with 10:31 to go in the first half. Dallas snapped the ball in Cards territory for the 1st time on its next drive but ultimately had to punt. On AZ's next play from scrimmage, Kirk sprinted down the deep middle and Murray hit him in stride for an 80-yard TD strike. In just over 8 minutes of that made it 21-3 at intermission.

Dallas' opening possession of the 3rd quarter ended when CB Dre Kirkpatrick picked off Dalton and AZ took over at its own 21. The Cards then ran 8 times for 73 yards on the 79-yard drive (the only non-rushing yards came on a DPI penalty) and Murray ran it in from a yard out. The score remained 28-3 late in the 3rd after Zuerlein missed a 58-yard FG try. Early in the 4th, Dallas reached the AZ16 when Baker ended the threat with his diving INT of a Dalton pass intended for Amari Cooper. That led to Zane Gonzalez's 26-yard FG that made it 31-3. The Cowboys found the end zone for the only time in the game with 2:48 left on a 1-yard Dalton-to-Cooper pass but on the 1st play after the 2:00 warning, Drake took a handoff and went untouched for a 69-yard TD that provided the final margin.

Six days after a win at Dallas on Monday Night Football, the Cardinals found themselves on the national stage again as their week 7 home game vs. Seattle was moved to Sunday night due to COVID concerns with the previously scheduled Bucs-Raiders game. The Seahawks had not lost in AZ since 2012 and came to town undefeated (5-0) on the strength of the NFL's #1 scoring offense and early-season MVP favorite Russell Wilson. But in a game with more swinings than a driving range, the Cards kept it close despite trailing for almost the entire contest. They would rally from 10 points down in the final 2:30 to tie the game in regulation and then win it in dramatic fashion in 0T. The teams combined for almost 1,100 yards of offense (SEA 572, AZ 519) and the two QBs were sensational. Wilson led his team to 27 first half points, but also threw 3 INTs – his first in AZ since his 2012 rookie season – and the Cards defense held Seattle to just 7 points after intermission. His counterpart Kyler Murray threw for 3 TDs and 360 yards while adding 67 yards and a TD on the ground. WR DeAndre Hopkins caught 10 passes for 103 yards with a TD while WR Christian Kirk had a pair of TD grabs for the 2nd straight week. RB Chase Edmonds also played a vital role and finished with 145 combined yards (58 rushing/87 receiving) on 12 touches. With the win, AZ improved to 5-2 and pulled within half a game of the division lead.

Seattle opened the game with scores on its first two possessions and took an early 10-0 lead. WR Tyler Lockett capped a 6-play, 75-yard game opening drive with a 3-yard TD pass from Wilson and then Jason Myers added a 41-yard FG. Late in the first, Murray tossed it deep down the left sideline and Hopkins hauled it in near the front pylon for a 35-yard score that made it 10-7. After another Myers FG, the Seahawks were up 13-7 and threatening again when they had it 1st-n-goal at the AZ3. But All-Pro safety Budda Baker read the next play perfectly, picking off Wilson's pass at the 2 and returning it 90 yards before being tackled by WR DK Metcalf. Five plays later, AZ went for it on 4th-n-goal from the 3 but were turned away. Seatle then went 97 yards in 6 plays and Carlos Hyde's 24-yard TD run made it 20-7 with 4:10 left in the 1st half. Rather than be demoralized by that turn of events, the Cardinals responded. Murray completed 5 straight passes for 75 yards – the biggest of which was a 41-yarder to TE Dan Arnold – and he capped it with a 7-yard TD toss to Kirk. That made it 20-14 with 74 seconds left in the half but that was not the end of the scoring. A Wilson scramble picked up 22 and two plays later he connected deep with Lockett, this one a 47-yarder that made it 27-14 with :51 left. But again the Cards shook it off. Murray completed four in a row for 42 yards helping set-up Zane Gonzalez's 49-yard FG as the half expired to pull within 10 at 27-17.

The first points of the 3rd quarter came when Murray led a 12-play, 93-yard drive and ended it with his 5-yard scoring run off the left side. That trimmed the lead to 3 and the Cards got the ball back when Patrick Peterson picked off a Wilson pass in the end zone. On the next play, AZ returned the favor as FS Quandre Diggs' INT gave the Seahawks possession at the AZ45. They advanced to the AZ3 where they went for it on 4th down and succeeded with Lockett's toe-tapping ID catch in the back of the end zone. Down 10 with 6:44 to play, the Cards again were up against it. But Murray and the offense once again responded. A 52-yard Gonzalez FG appeared to trim it to 7 with 3:02 left. However, a Seattle personal foul gave the Cards a 1st down and two plays later Murray hit Kirk for an 8-yard TD that made it 34-31 with 2:33 to play. The Cards then needed a stop and reserve LB Tanner Vallejo provided it when he tackled Hyde for no gain on 3rd-n-2 at the SEA34 with 1:02 to play. AX took over at its own 20 with :52 left and no timeouts. Two Murray passes picked up 27, his run up the middle gained 15 and Edmonds' 12-yard rush took it to the 26. That led to Gonzalez's 44-yard FG as time expired, sending the game to overtime. Seattle won the toss and got the ball first in the extra period but sacks from LB Haason Reddick and CB Byron Murphy Jr. forced a punt. Edmonds runs of 32 and 9 yards helped set-up a FG attempt but the 41-yard try was wide left setting Seattle up at its 31 with 2:42 to go. A 48-yard Metcalf TD catch and run was negated by a hold and on the next play, the Seahawks faced a 3rd-n-14 near midfield. Rookie LB Isaiah Simmons then dropped from his blitz position into coverage and was in perfect position to INT Wilson's quick pass attempt to Lockett. With :57 left, the Cards had the ball at the SEA49. They moved 19 yards before Gonzalez's 48-yard FG sailed through the uprights to give AZ its only lead of the night and the key division win.

RECAP

The Dolphins and Cardinals met in a week 9 match-up of teams riding 3-game win streaks and led by dynamic young quarterbacks. Neither of the two talented signal-callers disappointed. Miami's Tua Tagovailoa was 20-28 for 248 passing with 2 TDs while his Cardinal counterpart Kyler Murray was even more impressive. Thru the air he was 21-26 for 283 yards with 3 TDs (no INTs) and on the ground became just the 2nd QB in franchise history to top 100 rushing with 106 on 11 carries and a TD. In a back-and forth affair, AZ took a 7-point lead into the 4th quarter before Miami scored 10 straight to go up 3 and the Cardinals late attempt to tie it came up short. Both teams moved to 5-3 on the season with the outcome.

Miami struck first in the game when DE Emmanuel Ogbah ended AZ's 1st offensive possession by stripping Murray and fellow DE Shaq Lawson returned it for a 36-yard TD. From there, each team's offense would produce long TD drives on the next 4 possessions. First the Cards moved 75 yards in 10 plays and Murray capped the drive with a 4-yard TD pass to TE Maxx Williams who returned to the lineup after missing 6 games with an injury. RB Jordan Howard's 2-yard TD run ended the ensuing Dolphins drive and put them up 14-7 but the Cards again answered quickly. Christian Kirk hauled in his 5th TD in three games, this one a 56-yarder on a beautiful deep ball from Murray that tied it at 14. After Tua and WR Preston Williams connected on a 9-yard TD, Miami was back up by 7. Zane Gonzalez's 37-yard FG pulled AZ to within 4 at 21-17 with 5:06 to play in the first half but his counterpart Jason Sanders connected from 56 on the final play before intermission to put Miami up 24-17.

The Cards opened the 3rd quarter by moving 87 yards in 7 plays and TE Darrell Daniels scored his 1st career TD when he came down with an athletic grab in the end zone to tie it at 24. The next AZ drive was also a long one (11 plays, 84 yards) and Murray ended it with his 8th rushing TD of the year, this one a 12-yarder that put the Cards up 7 late in the 4th. It would not hold up. Miami moved 93 yards in 10 plays and Tua tied the game with his 11-yard TD pass to back-up WR Mack Hollins. AZ appeared to be in position to again answer when Murray marched the team into Dolphins territory. But on 4th-n-1 from the MIA40 with 5:30 to play, BC thase Edmonds was stopped short. Two minutes later, Sanders' 50-yard FG put the visitors up 34-31 with 3:30 to play. The Cards again quickly moved into scoring position when a 35-yard Murray-to-Kirk connection took it to the MIA40. After an incompletion on 3rd-n-1, Gonzalez attempted a 49-yard gametying FG but it was just short. One Dolphins first down was all they needed to put the game away and they got it.

Recap

In week 10, the 7-2 Bills came to Arizona to take on the 5-3 Cardinals. It turned into an instant classic and the ending was one for the ages. For much of the game it was the visitors from the east who appeared in control and they had a 14-point lead midway through the 3rd quarter. QB Kyler Murray then led the Cards back with a pair of rushing TDs that were part of a 17-0 Arizona run. Trailing by 3, the Bills reclaimed the lead on a TD with :34 left and it appeared headed for the W. But Murray and WR DeAndre Hopkins had other plans and ripped the victory away with a 43-yard Hail Mary on the game's final play from scrimmage.

The game began with AZ moving efficiently to the Buffalo 5 on the opening drive. The Cards could not advance further and Zane Gonzalez's 23-yarder made it 3-0. The lead was short-lived as Buffalo launched a 63-yard TD drive. The biggest play was a 31-yard catch-and-run by WR John Brown on 3rd-n-8 at the AZ45. That set up a trick play that saw WR Isaiah McKenzie toss a 12-yard TD pass to QB Josh Allen that made it 7-3. Buffalo added to the lead on its next drive with the first of three long, first half FGs from Tyler Bass. This one ricocheted off the right upright from 54 yards out made it 10-3. The Cards answered with a FG drive of their own and Gonzalez's 42-yarder made it 10-6. The back-and-forth continued and Bass' 55-yard FG extended Buffalo's lead to 13-6 with 5:45 remaining in the 2nd quarter. On the ensuing drive, AZ's offense went for it on 4th-n-5 at the BUF48 when Murray found TE Dan Arnold for 6 to move the chains. Later in the drive, the Cards faced 3rd-n-13 at the 21 when a Murray run picked it up. However they could not ultimately put it in the end zone and Gonzalez's 3rd FG of the half (a 21-yarder) made it 13-9 with 1:24 to play before halftime. That was enough time for the Bills to move into position for another long FG try from Bass and his 58-yarder as the half expired put Buffalo up 16-9 at intermission.

The Bills got the ball to start the 2nd half and the AZ defense forced Buffalo to punt for the first time in the game. However on the next play from scrimmage, RB Kenyan Drake fumbled and Buffalo recovered at the AZ36. Three plays later, Allen hit WR Cole Beasley on a 22-yard scoring pass and the Bills lead grew to 23-9 with 9:52 to go in the 3rd. The Cards needed an answer and Murray provided it going 5-5 passing for 68 yards and running it in from a yard out to make it 23-16. The next AZ drive ended with a 45-yard Gonzalez FG that pulled the Cards to within 4 at 23-19 and then a Patrick Peterson INT set the next series up at the AZ44. A 28-yard Murray run moved into Bills territory and his 15-yard ID run ended the drive and put AZ up 26-23 with 0:08 left in the 3rd. It was Murray's 2nd rushing TD of the game and 10th of the year. After neither offense produced points on the next 6 combined drives, Buffalo took over at its own 22 with 0:08 to go and trailing by 3. By the 2:00 warning they were at midfield and then with 0:34 left from the 21, Allen lofted it to the end zone where Stefon Diggs made a diving catch for the go-ahead TD. Trailing by 4, the Cards then had 2 timeouts and 34 seconds to try to go 75 yards. After a 14-yard completion to Andy Isabella and 9-yarders to Hopkins and Larry Fitzgerald, AZ had it at the BUF43 with :11 left. Murray rolled to his left, escaped a sack and as he approached the sideline, turned his body into position to launch it toward the end zone. There Hopkins ascended between 3 defenders and somehow came down with the football for the game-winner.

WEEK 11 Arizona Cardinals 21, Seattle Seahawks 28 Lumen Field Nov 19, 2020



Arizona Cardinals 0 21 Seattle Seahawks 7 28

Recap
In a week 11 Thursday night tilt, the Cardinals traveled to Seattle to face the Seahawks in a match-up of 6-3 teams tied atop the NFC West. It also featured offenses that ranked #1 in total yards (AZ) and #1 in points scored (SEA). While the hosts would jump out to a 16-7 halftime lead, the Cards would rally. But unlike their game against Buffalo four days earlier that ended on an unforgettable Hail Mary pass from Kyler Murray to DeAndre Hopkins, this time the Cards comeback came up just short and Seattle earned a 28-21 victory.

The Seahawks jumped out first with a touchdown on the game's opening drive; it covered 75 yards in 12 plays and ended with Russell Wilson's 25-yard TD pass to WR DK Metcalf. Late in the 1st quarter, a 3-n-out forced by the AZ defense resulted in the Cards offense taking over at midfield following the punt. A 25-yard Murray pass to TE Maxx Williams took it to the 2 and from there, RB Kenyan Drake punched it in to tie the game. The play was originally ruled by referee Tony Corrente's crew as a fumble in the field of play recovered by Seattle but a replay review clearly showed that Drake was both down and had broken the plane for the score. The Seahawks answered on their next drive moving 75 yards in 10 plays and WR Tyler Lockett hauled in an 11-yard pass from Wilson that made it 13-7 after Jason Myers PAT try missed. On the final play of the half, however, Myers did not miss from 27 yards out and Seattle led 16-7 at intermission.

The Cards opened the 2nd half by moving 81 yards in 11 plays and Murray's 4-yard scoring pass to TE Dan Arnold trimmed the lead to 16-14. On the ensuing drive, the Cards stopped Seattle on a 3rd-n-7 from the AZ37 but an unsportsmanlike conduct foul on CB Dre Kirkpatrick – one of 10 total penalties called against AZ on the evening – extended the drive. A 15-yard Carlos Hyde run took it to the 2 and on the next play he ran it in from there to make it 23-14 with 5:20 remaining in the 3rd quarter. The Cards would not go away and moved 90 yards in 15 plays on the ensuing drive. Murray completed 7 of 8 passes and threw for 80 of those 90 yards, capping the possession with a 3-yard toss to a wide-open RB Chase Edmonds in the back of the end zone. Trailing 23-21, the Cards took over at their own 14 with 9:23 left following a Seahawks punt. But an intentional grounding on the 1st play backed it up to the 2 and a hold in the end zone on the 2nd resulted in a safety and 25-21 score. Following the free kick, Seattle moved to the AZ12 when Hyde lost control of a pitch from Wilson but the Cards could not recover the loose ball. That led to Myers' 41-yard FG that made it 28-21. After the score and kickoff, AZ took over at its own 21 with 2:15 to play and needing a TD to tie it. Murray completions to Larry Fitzgerald (3-23), Andy Isabella (6) and Christian Kirk (12) combined with an 11-yard Edmonds run moved it to the Seattle 27 with :54 left. But after 3 incompletions, AZ faced a 4th-n-10 from there and the game ended when Murray was sacked by LB Carlos Dunlap.
